

Interim Report Cards

The staff of Pierre Elliott Trudeau High School is committed to ensuring that all students have a successful academic year. We believe that early intervention is important. Interim Reports Cards will be sent out electronically on Tuesday October 17 and Wednesday October 18 to students' GAPPS accounts. The purpose of the interim report card is to provide assessment feedback to both students and parents regarding their child's learning of the subject curriculum expectations.



The interim report card shows absences/lates and a current level of achievement based on assessment data. It is important to note that it is early in the semester and this report should be seen as a beginning snapshot of your child's progress.

Please continue to discuss your son/daughter's progress with a focus on their learning skills, their strengths and possible next steps for improvement.

SMOKE-FREE ACT of ONTARIO

According to the Smoke-Free Act of Ontario (2017), any individual, including students, caught vaping on school property can be subject to a fine imposed by a Tobacco Enforcement Officer. This fine amounts to \$305. We believe it is crucial to make you aware of this regulation, as it serves as a reminder of the legal consequences associated with vaping on school grounds.



We kindly request your support in educating your child about the risks and legal consequences of vaping. It is important that they understand the rules and regulations in place to ensure their safety and the safety of their peers. Unfortunately, we had a fire alarm go off at Pierre Elliott Trudeau on Wednesday September 27th which we suspect was due to vaping in a washroom. Vaping not only poses health risks but also disrupts the learning environment and sets a negative example for others.

Your assistance in talking with your child about the health risks of vaping is important. If you require support in this area, please do not hesitate to reach out to us. We are here to support you in any way we can.


