• Costumes should be respectful of others. Symbols or objects representative of a person's culture or religious beliefs should not be worn as a costume, nor should costumes that caricature social identities through stereotyping.

 Halloween masks are not to be worn and students should only use single-use make-up (no sharing of make-up

• Costumes that depict violence, alcohol, or drugs are not permitted.

In the spirit of Truth and Reconciliation, it is important that costumes do not trivialize and devalue the lives of Indigenous peoples in Canada.

This day presents a unique opportunity for your child to explore career options and gain insights into the professional world. No in-person classes will be held at Pierre Elliott Trudeau High School.

For "Take Our Kids to Work" Day on November 1st, students have two options:

Virtual or In-person Workplace Visit: Your child can accompany a parent, guardian, or friend to their workplace in-person or virtually to experience a typical workday. This option allows students to see firsthand what various careers entail and ask questions about different professions.

Independent Career Exploration: If a workplace visit is not feasible, your child can participate in career exploration activities at home. We will provide resources and guidance to help them explore different careers, industries, and develop a greater understanding of the world of work.

School Bus Zone - NO PARKING OR STOPPING

Our school bus drop off and pick up zone is beside the curb in the parking lot on the east side of the school. This is a reminder to parents when you are dropping off and picking up students to keep this area open for our buses to stop and allow students to get on and off their bus. Automobiles blocking this area are subject to a ticket from the Town of Markham.

Smoke Free School Environment

We want to remind students that the use of electronic products such as vaping, electronic cigarettes and cigars as well as cartridges of nicotine solutions and related products are not permitted on or within 20 metres of school property. This means 20 metres *beyond* the school boundaries as opposed to simply off of school property. <u>Health Canada</u> reports health risks associated with vaping particularly for young people.

This is in compliance with the Smoke-Free Ontario Act, which is enforced locally by York Region Community and Health Services and the <u>Tobacco and Smoke-Free Environment Policy and</u> <u>Procedure</u>. A progressive form of discipline, including suspension from school and <u>fines (up to</u> \$5,000), is in place for students who break the law.

New School Sign In and Out Procedures at Trudeau

We want to inform you about a new visitor procedure that we are implementing at Pierre Elliott Trudeau High School. This new procedure is part of our ongoing efforts to create a more welcoming and secure environment for our school community.

We kindly request that all visitors to our school begin their visit by signing in at the main office. This includes parents, guardians, volunteers, and any other guests. After signing in you will be asked to wear a guest tag which can be returned when you are leaving the building and sign out.

This process will help us keep track of who is in the building. By doing so, we aim to create a safer and more secure environment for our students and staff.

SMOKE-FREE ACT of ONTARIO

According to the Smoke-Free Act of Ontario (2017), any individual, including students, caught vaping on school property can be subject to a fine imposed by a Tobacco Enforcement Officer. This fine amounts to \$305. We believe it is crucial to make you aware of this regulation, as it serves as a reminder of the legal consequences associated with vaping on school grounds.

We kindly request your support in educating your child about the risks and legal consequences of vaping. It is important that they understand the rules and regulations in place to ensure their safety and the safety of their peers. Unfortunately, we had a fire alarm go off at Pierre Elliott Trudeau on Wednesday September 27th which we suspect was due to vaping in a washroom. Vaping not only poses health risks but also disrupts the learning environment and sets a negative example for others.

Your assistance in talking with your child about the health risks of vaping is important. If you require support in this area, please do not hesitate to reach out to us. We are here to support you in any way we can.
