


My Experience and Advice for High School by CL

Update on Student Timetables

Timetable

We wanted to provide you with an important update regarding the current timetable issues at PETHS.

Our Guidance Counsellors have been working tirelessly to resolve conflicts and ensure that our students receive the education they deserve. We understand that not having a full course load can cause anxiety, and we want to assure you that we are actively addressing this matter with the highest priority.

Here are some key points to keep you informed:

1. **Prioritizing Affected Students**: Our top priority is students who do not currently have the required number of courses for their respective grade levels. Specifically, we are focusing on students in Grades 9 to 11 who do not have eight courses and Grade 12 students who do not have six courses.

2. Seeking Additional Sections: To address these course conflicts, we have taken steps to request additional sections of certain courses from the Board. This effort may involve hiring more teachers or making necessary adjustments to our schedules.

3. **Contacting Absent Students**: We have also initiated contact with students who did not attend school this week. This outreach is intended to determine whether these students still plan to attend PETHS. By doing this it opens up spaces in course.

We want to reassure you that rectifying these issues is of utmost importance to us. Our goal is to have all affected students back in class as soon as possible.

Grade 12 Courses

We have few spaces left in Grade 12 courses. We are recommending that Grade 12 students sign up for a Night School or Remote Learning course through My Blueprint this weekend if they require a specific course this semester that is unavailable at PETHS.

We understand the concern and frustration that these timetable challenges may have caused, and we appreciate your patience and support as we work diligently to resolve them. If you have any specific questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to reach out to an alpha VP for assistance.


