Administration Report - D. Imada Chan

Friday, Sept 5th: Wellness break: One component of our school improvement plan is to focus on wellness, in particular, we want students to make the connection between wellness, resiliency and success.

Monday, September 8th: Safe Schools Assembly for all grades. It consisted of a presentation by the administrative team, as well as our School Community Resource Officer, PC Drummond. The purpose is to ensure students have a clear understanding of the school expectations and how they can have a successful year at Trudeau.

Wednesday, September 10th: School Photo Day. For those students who have missed taking their picture, there will be another opportunity on Friday, October 3rd.

Friday, September 12th: New Teacher Induction Program: All new teachers participate in this program for their professional learning and are designed to support new teachers during their first year at Trudeau.

Monday, September 15th: Department Heads' meeting. The head's discussed the Ministry of Education's new vision, Achieving Excellence and worked on our School Improvement Planning teams to create the action plans that will carry out the strategies that we have identified as of importance for this year.

Monday, September 22nd: Our staff will be undergoing extensive training and learning around various health and safety matters, all designed to keep our learning and working community a safe one.

Related to safety, we have already had one fire drill and next week will have our first lockdown drill.

Administration Report - P.Viscomi

Mark Reporting: Families get provincial report card twice a semester: at midterm and again at the end of the semester. Additionally, they will get an interim report 6 weeks into the semester - no marks are reported, just a level is given. First Interim reports will be sent home on October 17^{th.} These reports are passed out in homeroom. Marks also available in the e-bulletin if parents have signed up.

OSSLT (Gr. 10 Literacy test) Students must pass to earn their diploma.

Some results from the 2013-2014 OSSLT:

- 424 students took the test for the first time. 17% are ELLs.
- 57% of the students do not have English as a first language.
- 73% read for one or more hours at home. Most students like non-fiction.
- 55% of students write for one or more hours beyond their homework.
- 89% of our students are successful (77% success provincially).
- 70% of students with special education needs were successful (44% provincially).
- Previously eligible students (57), 84% were successful (50% provincially)

Supports for the OSSLT:

- Lit Blitz held one period a month dedicated to practising literary skills.
- Afterschool course regarding literacy.
- Embed literacy in all courses.

Administration Report - P. Simmons

EQAO Math - This test is written in the same semester student takes math and is counted as 5% of their mark. Grade 9 Results for 2013-2014

- 64% of applied students achieving were at or above the provincial standard (improved by 4%).
- 96% of our academic students were at or above provincial standards.

Grade 9 Transition to high school: Many steps are taken to ensure a smooth transition for grade 9 students. They include:

- Grade 8 Visit
- Network meetings between schools-teachers at Trudeau meet with staff from feeder schools
- Orientation Day first day of school is only for Gr. 9
- Trudeaumania full day just for Gr. 9 and mentors when they meet and interact with other Gr. 9
- Support Team: Guidance Counselors, Student Success, teachers
- Students can speak with the teachers, administrative team anytime

Parents and Community Report-R. Malhotra

Parents Reaching Out Grant-Grant from Ministry of Education to increase parent engagement. Each year funds are available up to \$1,000. We have received a grant for 2014-2015 for \$1,000.
