

Last week, an average of 700 people visited the library each day!










STUDENTS COME TO THE LIBRARY TO...

- All other materials are signed out for 3-week loans, with unlimited renewals.









How many have you read?










We are continuing to grow and will be working to monitor and adjusted in the coming years—with growth comes changes.

Staffing Process

January-February: Course Selection window

End Feb: Course Selection due

mid-March: Course verification;

changes due back

End of March: Courses with very low

numbers are cancelled.

End of March/beginning of April: Principal and Staff members attend meeting to get a number of sections (this is a fixed number by the board, very difficult to change).

Early-mid April: Admin in consultation with Dept Heads and Staffing Team makes final decisions on how many sections for each course shall be allocated.

mid-April to mid-May: Timetable built

mid-May to End of June: Conflicts resolved; alternate courses used without consultation with students to solve conflicts

Myths and Facts...

MYTH...

 First to submit course selection gets all their choices.

FACT...

 All students who submit selections and verifications by school deadlines are scheduled at the same time.

MYTH...

 Principals can add extra courses if there are enough students that want them.

FACT...

- Principals must adhere to staffing sections as assigned.
- The number of courses is set in April for the following September.

Myths and Facts Continued...

MYTH...

• One extra person in the class does not make a big difference and is okay.

FACT...

 Each course has a class maximum set by the board that can not be exceeded.

MYTH...

• The prerequisites in the course calendar do not really matter.

FACT...

 Prerequisites are set by the ministry and we must follow these rules.

 Kinesiology to go into Kinesiology; Food and
