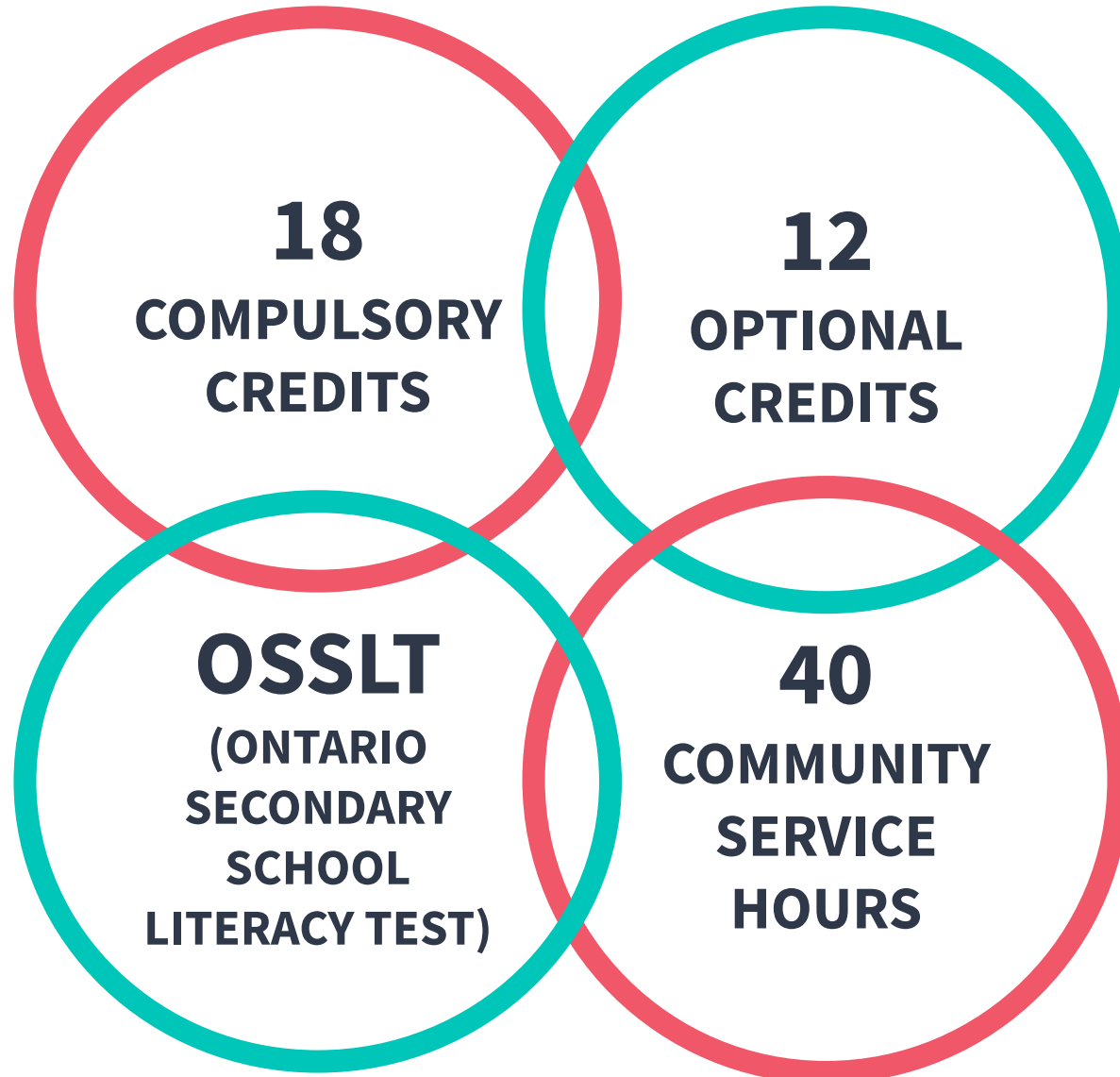

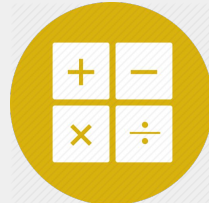

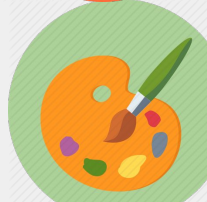

# ONLINE LEARNING GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

- Students are required to earn at least two online learning credits to meet the requirements for their Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD).



- **Opting out**  
Parents who wish to opt out or exempt their child from the online graduation requirement must complete the “**opt-out form**” available on the YRDSB website.

# FRENCH IMMERSION CERTIFICATE

To earn a **French Immersion Certificate** upon graduation, students must successfully complete a minimum of **10** French Immersion courses.

## SNC1W1

### DESTREAMED

- Course is not separated into academic or applied streams
- Will prepare students for university, college, apprenticeship & workplace pathways

## CGC1D1

### ACADEMIC

- Working at, or above grade level
- Theoretical and independent approach to learning with a focus on critical thinking skills

## MAT1L1

### LOCALLY DEVELOPED

- To be selected in consultation with your teacher(s) and family.

## ADA1O1

### OPEN

- Available to all students
- An opportunity to explore an area of interest for all students





# DESTREAMING PLAN

**AS PART OF THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION'S DESTREAMING PLAN, ALL COURSES ARE ONLY OFFERED THROUGH ONE COURSE TYPE**

“As part of the Ministry of Education’s de-streaming plan, secondary schools in Ontario offered a new grade 9 Math course in September which took the place of both Grade 9 Academic and Applied Math. The Ministry recently announced that a new de-streamed grade 9 Science course, which will replace the current grade 9 Academic and Applied Science courses, will be implemented in September 2022. Additionally, the remaining Grade 9 Applied courses (English, French and Geography) will no longer be offered in the next school year. This means that almost all grade 9 students will be taking Academic programming in these subject areas with the exception of a small percentage of students who may take Locally Developed courses.”

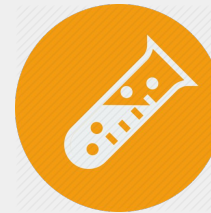

# What's the difference between de-streamed and locally developed?

- Locally Developed courses support the needs of students who have been receiving significantly modified programming in Grade 8.
- Locally Developed courses are offered at the Grade 9 and Grade 10 level in some schools in the areas of English, Math, Science and/or History.
- Students in Locally Developed courses learn content that is connected to everyday life.
- Programs at college and university with a high school mathematics course requirement will not accept courses in this pathway for admission.

# FRENCH IMMERSION REQUIREMENTS

**French Immersion students must complete 10 courses in French over the four years in high school.**

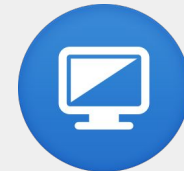

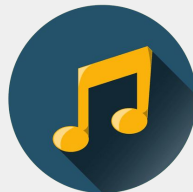

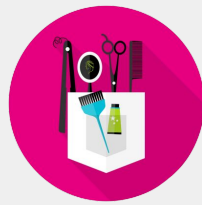

# EQAO TESTING

## GRADE 9 – MATH EQAO

- Written at the end of the semester that you have Math
- 2 days of testing during the regular math class
- Not a diploma requirement but 5% of final mark

## GRADE 10 - Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT)

- A diploma requirement
- Test based on the Ontario curriculum expectations for reading and writing up to the end of grade 9
- Results will be reported as a pass on the transcript
