

DESTREAMING PLAN

AS PART OF THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION'S DESTREAMING PLAN, ALL COURSES ARE ONLY OFFERED THROUGH ONE COURSE TYPE

"As part of the Ministry of Education's de-streaming plan, secondary schools in Ontario offered a new grade 9 Math course in September which took the place of both Grade 9 Academic and Applied Math. The Ministry recently announced that a new de-streamed grade 9 Science course, which will replace the current grade 9 Academic and Applied Science courses, will be implemented in September 2022. Additionally, the remaining Grade 9 Applied courses (English, French and Geography) will no longer be offered in the next school year. This means that almost all grade 9 students will be taking Academic programming in these subject areas with the exception of a small percentage of students who may take Locally Developed courses."

What's the difference between de-streamed and locally developed?

- Locally Developed courses support the needs of students who have been <u>receiving significantly modified programming in Grade 8</u>.
- Locally Developed courses are offered at the Grade 9 and Grade 10 level in some schools in the areas of English, Math, Science and/or History.
- Students in Locally Developed courses learn content that is connected to everyday life.
- Programs at college and university with a high school mathematics course requirement will not accept courses in this pathway for admission.

FRENCH IMMERSION REQUIREMENTS

French Immersion students must complete 10 courses in French over the four years in high school.

- Not a diploma requirement but 5% of final mark

GRADE 10 - Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT)

- A diploma requirement
- Test based on the Ontario curriculum expectations for reading and writing up to the end of grade 9
- Results will be reported as a pass on the transcript
