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What is the YRDSB Regional **Specialized Arts** Program?

The Secondary Arts Program is a 4 year program for YRDSB students who are committed to achieving excellence in the Arts. The program offers a package of specialized Arts credits (2 per year) that count towards the Ontario Secondary School Diploma. Students will receive a certificate upon completion. Students are invited to apply to the school that corresponds with their Arts Student Flow to Sec 2023.pdf.

Students may apply to study one of the Arts program disciplines, including: dance, drama, visual arts and music (vocal and instrumental). Some schools offer piano, string and theatre technology. Multiple applications may be submitted by one student to one school.

What is the YRDSB Regional Specialized Arts Program?

There are four secondary schools offering the Specialized Arts program in the York Region District School Board. These include:

- Alexander Mackenzie High School
- Huron Heights Secondary School
- Unionville High School
- Westmount Collegiate Institute



Boundaries




Families can locate their boundaries on YRDSB.ca under "School Locator"

Boundaries



- Dance/ Drama/ Visual Arts: Student must reside within Arts Unionville HS boundary
- Music Winds/Percussion and Vocal: must reside within the Arts Unionville HS boundary
- Music Strings: Student must reside within the Arts Unionville HS boundary or Huron Heights boundary
- Music Piano: Student may reside anywhere in York Region



Why might I select the program?



There are many benefits and highly valued transferable skills learned from an Arts Education, including...

Creativity, confidence, critical thinking, perseverance, communication, time management, collaboration, self expression, social emotional awareness, focus, dedication, accountability, technical training and skill development, portfolio development...and many more.



About the Program



- Students accepted into the program will take 8 credits within their chosen discipline (2 credits per year, 1 per semester).
- Students will spend their 4 years of high school with other students
 accepted into that program. The group or cohort of AU students take all
 of their AU classes together and move through grades 9 to 12 together.
- Students will earn a certificate upon completion.



Core Programs

Our high school is proud to offer an excellent core arts program for all of our students. Students do not need to be enrolled in a Regional Arts program to receive an Arts education.

- Students in the Regional Arts program may also select from these courses in addition to their 8 Arts credits.
- Our Core program provides a wide range of courses that engage and address a range of interests and abilities.
- Any student interested in expanding their learning pertaining to the arts are encouraged to join SHSM in grade 11.

Fashion Design - Grades: 11

Architectural Design - Grade: 12





Step 1: Registration Information



KEY DATES:

- Opens November 10th, 2023
- Closes December 1st, 2023
 - Must be completed in 1 sitting.

Registration will be done through Edsby.

The link will be posted to the ARTS page of each Arts School.

Maximum of 2 applications per student.

Cost of \$20 each application

A virtual application process will follow the Registration.

Communicated to registrants week of December 12th, 2022



What do you need for Registration?



- Your Student Number & OEN Number (found on a student's report card)
- Student's Name, gender and date of birth
- Student's home address and phone number
- Parent/Guardian Name and contact information
- Student's current school, grade and which YRDSB Secondary
 School the student would normally attend
- At registration, you may indicate a maximum of of 2 disciplines the students wishes to apply for
 - Please note there is an additional cost for each application



Step 2: Application Process



The selection process will be in person, with the option for an e-Portfolio if the candidate is unable to attend.

- We invite interested students to submit their registration via Edsby. Once submitted, we will be contacting registrants and outlining the process to prepare the selection process.
- The criteria, by discipline, for the process will be shared with registrants & posted to each school's Arts page.
- The application details will be shared on December 12, 2022.



Step 2: Criteria for Successful Selection



 The audition process gives applicants the opportunity to demonstrate their interest, passion and experience in the arts

Specific details will be discussed in discipline presentations



Step 3: Selection



All registrants who submit an application will receive notification at the end of January to early February.

Registrants will receive:

- An offer of acceptance
- A notification that they are on a waitlist
- A notification that they were not successful

Students must accept or decline an offer.

At this point, schools will begin the Grade 9 registration process.

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Visual Arts Selection Process 2023



The selection process is in person, with the option for an e-Portfolio if the candidate is unable to attend.

A: **In Person**. Applicants are requested to participate in one of the three day in person workshops and portfolio assessment.

B: **Virtual e-Portfolio**. Should an applicant be unable to attend one day of the in person workshop dates, an e-portfolio option is available. Please contact the Unionville High School office for further details.



In Person Workshop - Part A (overview)

A Visual Arts teacher will provide a short lesson and examples prior to each task.

- 1. Create a value scale in pencil
- 2. Create a still life drawing each student will receive the same object to draw like a pair of pliers, light bulb or ribbon
- 3. Creativity challenge
- 4. Series of gesture drawings using a live model

In Person Portfolio Assessment - Part B (overview)

On the same day the candidate attends the workshop they will display their works, as identified below, from their portfolio. *Each candidate will have access to a table that has an approximate 3.5' by 2' surface to display their artworks.*

- 1. Self Portrait (any medium)
- 2. Sketchbook(s)
- 3. Still Life Drawing/Painting (any medium)
- 4. Sculptural 3D work (any medium)
- 5. Submit three optional works in any medium: Photography, Computer Generated, Drawings, Pen and Ink, Collage, etc.
- 6. Max 250 word artists statement










