





What is Philosophy?

The aim of philosophy is to construct and critically assess questions such as:

Value Theory: How should I live life? What is right and wrong, and what makes it right or wrong? What makes a society just or unjust?

Epistemology: What is knowledge? How can we trust experts? How do I know I'm not dreaming?

Metaphysics: Is everything predetermined? Do I have free will? Could AI ever be concious?

Practical Benefits

Philosophy improves critical reasoning and writing. On the Graduate Record Exam, students who study Philosophy score highest in verbal reasoning and analytical writing, higher than students of subjects like Physics and Economics.[1]

Philosophy develops logic skills. On the Law School Admissions Test, which tests logic skills, **students who study Philosophy score highest overall**. [2]
