Attention Students who have applied to post-secondary institutions.

The Guidance department would like to remind you that the full disclosure date is May 3^{rd} . Therefore, all courses continued past May 2^{nd} , and marks earned to date in these courses, must be shown (fully disclosed) on your official transcript. Please note that if you are looking to drop a course, there is a process and specific criteria in place that must be followed for students to do so.

Also, please note, this year's mid-term report cards are being issued two working days before the OCAS (Ontario Colleges Application Service) and OUAC (Ontario Universities Application Centre) upload needs to be completed. As a result, if you are applying to an Ontario College and/or an Ontario University and you do not want a course to be transferred to OCAS and/or OUAC, your task is to start the process to drop the course as soon as possible by making an appointment with your alpha Guidance Counsellor. Please speak with your teachers regarding your progress in your courses. Teachers will be able to provide you with an updated mark on April 18th.

Summary of dates:

- April 25- Deadline for student's to see alpha counsellor to drop a course
- April 26- Deadline for completed drop form to be returned to Guidance by 3:00 p.m.
- April 27- Transfer of mid-term marks to OCAS and OUAC
- May 3 official full disclosure date

Summer Learning Pilot Innovation Course

Description

Youth Innovation By Design focuses on ways in which innovators identify problems, see them as opportunities, generate ideas, and organize resources to develop and take successful solutions forward into the world, both for-profit and not-for-profit. Students will be encouraged to use a variety of design thinking techniques, including the Innovation, Creativity, and Entrepreneurship (ICE) Toolkit to develop and grow their ideas. They will consider the ethical and legal implications of decisions, the breadth of roles in innovation culture as well as sustainability models. In support of both group and individualized projects, students will be introduced to, and taught how to connect with, local and global ecosystems. Student learning throughout the course will be supported by guest speakers and mentors provided through a collaboration with York University's Markham Innovation Centre (YU-MIC) and Innovation York.



Moving Student Ideas Forward Through Design Thinking Processes



Dates and Location

- Summer school programs will be held from July 5-28, 2017 between 8:45 a.m. to 3:33 p.m.
- This pilot involves a collaboration with York University and will be offered at York University's Markham Innovation Centre - 169 Enterprise Blvd, Markham (third floor)

Note: Completion of this site is scheduled for May. Should delays in its completion arise, the course will be held at Milliken Mills Secondary School, 7522 Kennedy Rd, Markham.

Application Process:

- As a pilot, only one section of this course can be offered.
- The application process will close when 50 of these applications have been received or on April 28th, whichever comes first. The form can be found at: bit.ly/pilotinnovationcourse (opens April 3rd)
- Indicate that you are applying for the course by selecting it on career cruising - Summer Innovation Pilot
- Applicants will have until April 28th to also submit their parent signatures and reference forms, provided through the on-line application
- Applications will be screened for eligibility based on:
 - no conflicts with taking the selected grade 12 IDC credit;
 - references that provide strong support;
 - strong student rationale for being a good candidate for this pilot
- Eligible students will then be randomly chosen and all applicants will be informed via e-mail.

BEFORE YOU COMPLETE THE APPLICATION YOU NEED TO KNOW:

- that you have a transportation plan for getting to the two possible delivery sites
- which credit you are applying for: IDC4U or IDC4O
- ☐ that you do not already have a grade 12 IDC/IDP (Interdisciplinary Course) on your transcript
- that you have not selected to take a grade 12 IDC/ IDP (Interdisciplinary Course) for next year
- your student number
- the number of credits you will have by the end of the current school year
- parent/guardian contact information, including email address (if under 18)
- your response for why you think you are a good candidate for this pilot opportunity
- a plan for two references must include one teacher, but can also include employer, coach, community leaders etc.

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2017 COURSE OFFERINGS

Curriculum Relevant • Transformative • Fun

Leadership for Innovation and Creativity - 5 days/4 nights

Course Date: June 11-15

This course engages students interested in a journey of self-discovery and acceptance as they develop the leadership skills necessary to effectively combine their 'gift(s) with their passions'. This course is appropriate for those who are intellectually curious and may or may not be identified as "gifted".

Foundations of Youth Leadership - 5 days/4 nights

Course Date: August 25-29

Foundations of Youth Leadership is about discovering oneself at an entry point to life-long leadership. It focuses on exploring the various forms that leadership takes, emphasizing that each individual has the capacity to lead using their own unique abilities. Students will learn more about how leadership applies to them in their classrooms, school and communities.

Intermediate Arts: Emerging Leadership - 7 days/6 nights Course Dates: May 28-June 3, & August 19-25 Intermediate Arts attracts students who have an interest in the arts and in particular, those with leadership potential. Through music, dance, drama, creative writing and visual arts, students will explore how they can use the arts to bring out the best in themselves and others in their classrooms, school and communities.

Intermediate Athletics Leadership - 7 days/6 nights Course Dates: July 16-22, July 30-August 5, & August 13-19 Intermediate Athletics leadership harnesses the spirit of sport, physical activity and recreation to help students realize their leadership potential. This course will inspire students to believe in themselves and to make a difference in their classrooms, school, and communities.

7 Intermediate School Leadership - 7 days/6 nights

Course Date: August 6-12

Whether a student is taking their first leadership step, or they are emerging as a leader, this course has leadership pathways for all. Students will leave feeling more comfortable applying their leadership skills in their classrooms, school and communities.

Secondary Growing Leadership* - 5 days/4 nights

Course Date: May 6-10

This course is for students who are interested, or have a need for leadership development, that struggle with academics and organization, or access learning support services in their school. Teacher supports are encouraged to register for this course and grow alongside their students.

Secondary Arts: Inspiring Leadership - 7 days/6 nights

Course Date: June 26-July 2

Secondary Arts empowers students to use their creativity and passion to make a positive impact within their classrooms, school, and communities. Through this course, students will explore their own personal leadership styles and skills through many mediums of the arts, including music (vocal and instrumental), dance, visual arts, and drama.

Secondary Athletics Leadership* - 7 days/6 nights

Course Dates: July 2-8, & July 9-15

Secondary Athletics Leadership uses sport, recreation, and physical activity to harness their leadership potential. Through leadership development experiences, activity sessions and roundtable discussions students will identify how they can lead within their classrooms, school, and communities.

Secondary School Leadership (SSL) - 3 days/2 nights

Course Dates: October 11-13, & October 16-18

Participating with a teacher advisor from their school, student groups (ie. student, athletics or arts councils, clubs/committees or advocacy group) will discover their voice as "partners in education", developing a student-initiated action plan for return to their schools.

Who is SGL For?

This course serves Secondary students who have the adaptive skills to function, meet new people and follow schedules with limited transitional support. The course engages the participants socially, physically, and academically, and encourages them to share the gains they have made as they return to their schools. This course is suited for students for whom there is a 'yes' response to each of the following participant criteria:

- Does this student express interest in and/or have an identified need for leadership development?
- Would this student benefit from leadership sessions focused on good decision-making and an introduction to group and individual problem solving skills?
- Does the student access specialized and/or learning support services in the school?
- Does the student have the required adaptive skills (e.g. sleeping in cabin with up to 10 other people, using shared washroom facilities, able to complete their own activities of daily living) to function independently and follow schedules with limited transitional support?
- Does the student sometimes struggle with academics, following schedules, keeping organized?
- Does the student respond willingly and agreeably to authority?

Leadership Development Sessions

The leadership development sessions in Secondary Growing Leadership build on OELC's core capacities of communication, team building, risk-taking, goal setting, and personal challenge and expand it into three different themes: Knowledge of Myself as a Leader, Attitudes of a Leader and Skills of a Leader.

Workshops

Four workshops are part of the programming for each student leader. The workshops offer an opportunity to engage in small group collaboration and to employ and practice the skills being explored in the Leadership Development sessions. The areas of focus are:

- 1. Appropriate use of social media
- 2. Achieving goals as a team
- 3. Challenge by choice
- 4. Communication using more than your voice

Outdoor Activities

Students have a choice of many outdoor/recreational activities throughout the course designed to promote participation, cooperation and communication Outdoor activities include, but are not limited to the following: low ropes, climbing wall, large group games, tennis, basketball, beach volleyball, other recreational games and a culminating Team Olympics with Opening and Closing Ceremonies!
