Student Trustee Elections - Application Deadline Extended

If you will be in grade 11 or 12 next school year and are passionate about student voice, consider becoming a student trustee, and representing students across YRDSB.

Applications will be accepted until Monday, December 18 - 11:59 pm.

All students in Grades 5 - 12 will have an opportunity to vote for the candidate who represents our area of the Board. There are four areas of the Board: central, east, north and west. Once the four final candidates are announced, students can vote for two of the four candidates to represent them as student trustees in the 2024 - 2025 school year.

Students will receive information on how to vote in the election during the campaign and voting period.

Message from York Region Public Health

York Region Public Health will be reintroducing the enforcement of the Immunization of School Pupils Act, which had been paused during the COVID-19 pandemic. York Region Public Health will contact families of students missing immunizations directly.

Please make sure you have <u>provided your student's complete immunization records to YRPH and update them</u> every time your child gets vaccinated.

YRPH will be holding student immunization "catch up clinics" at <u>community immunization clinics</u> and secondary schools in York Region. Information about the catch up clinic at UHS is forthcoming.

Winter Food Drive

The Student Council and Muslim Students Association is running a winter food drive! We will have boxes set up at the Town Centre entrance for donations until **Friday, December 22**.

Hunger is a persistent problem. The people who turn to food banks include: families with children new Canadians; employed people whose wages not sufficient to cover basic living essentials; individuals on social assistance; and Canadians living on a fixed income, including seniors and people with exceptionalities.

The Markham Food Bank accepts financial (cash, cheque, or <u>online via Canada Helps</u>) and in-kind donations of non-perishable food, baby items, and hygiene products.

When making a donation to the Markham Food Bank, please ensure items are within the best before period, have not expired, and have not been opened. We are unable to accept homemade food and food that is no longer in the original packaging. We cannot accept alcohol or items with alcohol (e.g. chocolates with brandy).

STEM Update

We are excited to launch STEM Unionville (version 2.0)!
