

Co-operative Education is educational programming that integrates classroom theory with practical experience in the workplace. Programming is based on a partnership between the school and a local business or community organization. Co-op involves the participation of students, teachers and the

workplace (placement supervisors). Students can earn 2 or 4 credits while gaining real work experience!


Jr. Girls Volleyball


