



UHS Music Europe Trip



The UHS music trip to Europe was an incredible and unforgettable experience for the 96 students who flew, bussed, and walked all over Austria and the Czech Republic from February 12th to 21st. The choir, string ensemble and band performed three times and visited many historic sites, but more importantly, each of them grew as people through the experience.

The major part of the experience was, of course, musical. The group was privileged to visit the cities of Salzburg, Vienna, and Prague and to be immersed in the rich musical histories of each place. Before

the trip, the great composers such as Mozart and Dvorak might have seemed distant to our students, so it was inspiring to be able to walk through the same streets and buildings as these composers once did. When it came time to perform, all the hard work of the students and music teachers paid off as they entertained and impressed their audiences on three occasions, including a beautiful performance at the 18th century St. Nicholas church in the centre of Prague's Old Town Square.

Students also saw many academic topics in a new way, as concepts like acoustics, architecture, medieval history, World War II, and the "iron curtain" all came to life as we toured across the two countries.

Of course there are also the personal lessons we all learn from travelling - the way our worldview expands for us when we see other ways of life, try new foods, and try to communicate in new languages

with the people we meet. For the teachers who joined the trip, it was exciting to see the many ways that the students grew as people during their trip together, learning about their music, the broader world, and themselves.
