Ontario Secondary Literacy Test

The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) this year will be taking place on Tuesday, March 31, 2020. The OSSLT is a graduation requirement for all students in the province of Ontario.

If currently in grade 10, your child will be writing the OSSLT for the first time. All students that are writing the OSSLT this year are encouraged to join the After School Literacy Program that begins next week.

The After School Literacy Program consists of ten (10) sessions of one and a half (1.5) hours of intensive practice with reading and writing skills and strategies. We will be running two programs, each one ending just before the OSSLT. The details about each program are:

There is no fee to participate in this program and it is free for all students of UHS. Grade 10 students are invited to join through School Cash Online and must register there. Please choose **ONE** of the programs above that best suits your child's schedule and register through School Cash Online, under "After School Literacy - Semester Two".

These workshops have been designed to support students with passing the OSSLT this year, and are offered to help students gain a greater understanding of the skills required to be successful in both the reading and writing sections of the test.

Message from Our Trustee

As we enter another month of winter, this is a good time to be thinking about our health, well-being and the importance of selfcare. We know that, like all of us, our students can focus better when they feel better. Our schools play an important role in health and mental health promotion and education, and fostering well-being and mental health is one of our <u>priorities as a</u> <u>school board</u>.

There is a lot of work taking place in our schools and board to create <u>healthy schools</u> and promote <u>mental health</u> and well-being, including:

- Providing training and resources for educators on strategies to support mentally healthy classrooms for all students, including holding a mental health conference.
- Hiring identity specific mental health workers and developing partnerships with <u>community partners</u> to serve the diverse needs of our students.

Developing a <u>Student Suicide Intervention Protocol</u> to help keep students safe in the event of suicidal thoughts or actions.

Educating students about the risks of substance use and misuse, including vaping and cannabis.

Providing strategies and supports for students in preparing for exams and managing stress.

This commitment is also reflected in Board policy like the <u>Healthy Schools and Workplaces</u> policy and procedures. Setting policy, which governs the operation of the Board, is one of the <u>roles of trustees</u>, and we greatly value the input provided by students, staff members, family and community members. I encourage you to look at the <u>policies under review</u> and share your feedback.

We have a lot to look forward to in 2020. At the Board meeting in December, trustees unanimously approved the addition of <u>new permanent Indigenous Trustee and Indigenous Student Trustee positions</u>. We are committed to Indigenous Education in our Board and it is important that these voices are represented at the table. We hope to fill the positions as soon as possible and will share more information as it becomes available.

Winter Weather Notice

Dear Families,

As we go into the winter months, it is important that families are aware that there may be rare occasions when emergency weather events occur and we need to close all schools and Board locations.

Emergency winter weather

Emergency closures will be considered when facilities may not be safe for students and staff members to attend school for the full day. This may include events that significantly limit school operations or access to the school site, or cause widespread, prolonged power failures or downed power lines.

In keeping with our current practice, we will continue to keep our schools open as much as possible. However, it is important that families have alternate childcare arrangements planned for the rare occasions when schools may be closed. Before and after care programs will also not operate if schools are closed. Please take the time to make plans in the event of an emergency school closure.

School transportation cancellations

School transportation (buses and taxis) may be cancelled due to extreme cold or inclement weather. If transportation is cancelled in the morning, it will also be cancelled for the afternoon. On these days, schools will remain open unless otherwise stated.

Families can use their best judgment to decide whether to send their children to school on inclement weather days. Students will not be penalized for missing school. For safety reasons, you are required to let the school know if your child will not be attending school that day.

Communication to families

Decisions about school transportation and school closures will be made as early as possible and no later than 6:00 a.m.

We are introducing a new communications system that will send **text messages to parents/guardians for emergency purposes only**. This includes the rare event of a school closure. Parents/guardians have the ability to opt-out of receiving text messages should they choose.

We will do our best to notify families in advance when we may be considering closing school and Board offices. Our priority continues to be the safety of our students, staff members and families. If you have any questions, please speak with your school principal.
