Arts Camp is an intensive one-week immersion in performance-based and productgenerating art programs and experiences. To ensure the student experience is memorable, dynamic and fun, teachers, local and regional artists as well as student counselors, plan and facilitate amazing art programs and support a unique, inclusive environment for campers. 250 students ranging from Grade 7 to Grade 12 from across York Region attend morning and afternoon arts-based programs augmented by other daily workshops and activities. The weeklong camp culminates in an Art Show/Gallery Tour and Performance Night.
