Be part of the Inaugural year for the NewMarket National Play Festival!

Come out and support the not- for- profit Newmarket National 10 Min. Play Festival weekend from July 21st through July 23rd 2017!

You will support Canadian veteran performers and emerging playwrights share knowledge about Canadian Theatre! You can learn about our entertainment values as well as provide our youth with the chance to gain leadership and organizational skills by working with the public and apprenticing with artists. Volunteers will also gain experience in hospitality and tourism, event administration and planning, history and culture, mentoring, communication and technology. By attending you will help create future employment opportunities as this Festival grows, while having fun!! The Goal is to have a permanent full summer Theatre in Newmarket within 5 years, giving employment to our youth!

The shows consist of 24 pods of approx. 1.5hrs. Each pod contains six "10 min" plays held at Old Town Hall and Pickering College Theaters. Ten minute plays are not "sketches." They demand, just like full length plays, fully realized characters that make us laugh and weep, and stories that touch us to the core of our being. The challenge to the playwright is to create a world in 600 seconds that keeps each audience member fully committed to the truth of the story being told Plays have been submitted by Canadian playwriters from Newfoundland to Beijing! Between plays visit Riverwalk commons to see buskers, artist and playwriter readings, live plays, fine arts interpretations take in historical tours, and a special surprise at the end of the last show on Sat. Visit Main Street for Festilicious (discounted and special meals or dishes with your theatre ticket), put on by Main Street Merchants!

- Are you enthusiastic and outgoing?

- Have you been thinking of volunteering?

- All positions are evolving, and individuals should be able to work well with all types of people, be up for adventure, and be flexible

- You must attend one of the orientation sessions before the Festival in order to participate (dates to be determined), sign up for a minimum of 3 individual 2-hour shifts (arriving a minimum of 15 min before your shift as well) during the event of July 21-23.
- Youth volunteers must be able to be on your feet and able to move from location to location; be willing to rotate into any of the event services if needed, including merchandizing, event information, greeting guests, assisting visitors find the pop-ups on Riverwalk Commons, or with volunteer appreciation.
- You will need to dress appropriately for both the Festival venue and weather, as per the Festival dress code.

All report to the Team Captains:

Newmarket Ad:

Newmarket National Ten Minute Play Festival

Friday, July 21 to Sunday, July 23: To acknowledge Canada's sesquicentennial, the Town of Newmarket is creating a National Theatre Festival admiring our country's diverse voices and perspectives. The Town of Newmarket offers artists from across this great country; a national "new market" for their stories, and a national stage for their regional perspectives. Dates for the inaugural festival are Saturday, July 22 to Sunday, July 23, with a Fundraising Gala kickoff on Friday night, July 21st. Twenty-four original ten minute plays are packaged into four "pods" of six shows each playing at Pickering College Theatre (16945 Bayview Avenue) and Newmarket's newly refurbished Old Town Hall (460 Botsford Street) Theatre. Plays will be selected from submissions nationwide, with cash awards presented to the top three plays submitted. The festival features "Main Street" attractions such as Festilicious menus in local restaurants, art galleries, street markets, historical walking tours, and festivities at Riverwalk Commons. Festival goers can view up to three pods in one day. Cost is \$15 per performance, with discounts offered for the purchase of three or more pods. Ten minute plays are not "sketches." They demand, just like full length plays, fully realized characters that make us laugh and weep, and stories that touch us to the core of our being. The challenge to the playwright is to create a world in 600 seconds that keeps each audience member fully committed to the truth of the story being told.
