

We connect high school students with knowledgeable university mentors who provide FREE personalized guidance on program selection, the university application process, and insights into university life.

Why Sign Up Now?

- Grade 12s: If you are seeking help on how to navigate the university application process or if you'd like to speak to a current university student in a particular pathway or at a certain school, you can benefit from The NEST Project. Whether you'd prefer just 1 meeting or consistent bi-weekly meetings, our mentors will do their best to accommodate your needs. All of our mentors are trained and can provide valuable insights and share their experiences to help you make informed decisions.
- Grade 11s: It's never too early to initiate contact with a mentor! This way, when applications start the following year (September 2025), you'll already be well-prepared for the application process.
- Grade 9s & 10s: By getting started early, you can receive guidance on course selection, extracurricular activities, and other steps you can take now to prepare for the university application process.


Steps To Sign Up:

- 1. Visit our website, https://nestproject.ca, and click "Match Me With A Mentor" on the homepage.
- 2. Select the field of interest and view the list of mentors in that field.
- 3. Select a mentor you want to meet with, view their bio, and select "Book a meeting with [mentor's name]".
- 4. Please answer the brief list of questions in the form, and then select "Let's Schedule My Meeting!".
- 5. You'll be redirected to the mentor's Calendly schedule, where you can select a meeting time.
- 6. You'll then be asked a couple more questions to help the mentor prepare specific support for you.
- 7. You'll receive a confirmation email that includes a meeting link for you to use at the time of your meeting.




Exciting News!






TUHS Photography Strikes Gold at York Region Skills Competition!

When choosing a gown size, kindly consider the student's height, including the height of their shoes.



♦♦ IMPORTANT SAFETY MESSAGE FOR PARENTS: ENSURE SAFE CROSSING FOR YOUR CHILDREN!

Dear Parents and Guardians,

The safety of our Unionville HS students is our top priority, especially when it comes to crossing roads. As we know, crossing busy streets such as Highway 7 and Warden, poses potential risks. Here are some essential reminders to ensure our students cross the road safely:

- 1. Understand and adhere to school zone rules. These areas often have reduced speed limits and additional safety measures to protect pedestrians.
- 2. Ensure your child understands the basic rules of road safety looking both ways before crossing, waiting for the signal, and only crossing at designated crosswalks.
- 3. Emphasize the importance of using designated crosswalks. Explain that these areas are specifically designed for safe pedestrian crossing, reducing the risk of accidents.
- 4. Discourage the use of electronic devices while crossing the road. Remind them that paying attention to their surroundings is crucial for their safety.

Let's work together to create a community where our UHS students can navigate the roads confidently and safely. By reinforcing these simple yet crucial guidelines, we can contribute to a secure environment for all.
