# All Schools Closed to Students March 16 until April 5

By order of the Ontario Ministry of Education all Ontario publicly funded schools will be closed March 16 until April 5, 2020.

This is in an effort to reduce the spread of COVID-19. All schools in York Region District School Board will be closed to students during this time. Schools are expected to reopen on April 6, 2020.

All schools will be closed to students. Please do not send students to school March 16 until April 5. All school transportation services (including buses, taxis, etc.) will not be running.

School is expected to resume on April 6, 2020.

#### SUMMER SCHOOL

Registration for summer school will open on **April 6**<sup>th</sup>. Students can sign up through **My Pathway Planner under Continuing Education.** All students must print off their registration form and hand it in to Guidance for approval.

#### **Extended Absences**

If your child will be missing three or more consecutive days of instruction for a planned reason/event, they need to pick up **an extended absence form** in the main office well in advance of the absence.

After picking up the form, students will:

- -ensure that each of their teachers signs the form indicating that they are aware of the upcoming extended absence (teacher should discuss a plan to catch up on homework and assessments with your child)
- -ensure that their parent/guardian signs the form
- -ensure that the vice-principal signs the form; the vice-principal will then give the form to the attendance secretary


# No Parking Zone

# Dear Parents/Guardians:

Please be advised that there is a No Parking Zone located in front of the main entrance of the school on Town Centre Boulevard.
