Guidance News - Summer Learning Pilot Innovation Course

YRDSB is offering a new pilot course: Grade 12: Youth Innovation by Design (satellite location in Markham). This pilot is being offered with two different credit options from Interdisciplinary Studies: IDC40 (Grade 12, Open) or IDC4U (Grade 12, University Preparation). Please note, students that have taken or are enrolled to take an IDC4U cannot take this course. According to the Ministry of Education, students may take a **maximum of 1 Grade 12 University Preparation**.

Please take special note on the following information before students complete the Application.

Students must:

- have a transportation plan for getting to the two possible delivery sites
- know which credit they are applying for: IDC4U or IDC4O
- know that they do not already have a grade 12 IDC/IDP (Interdisciplinary Course) on their transcript
- that students have not selected to take a grade 12 IDC/IDP (Interdisciplinary Course) for next year
- know their student number
- the number of credits they will have by the end of the current school year
- parent/guardian contact information, including email address (if under 18)
- their response for why they think they are a good candidate for this pilot opportunity
- a plan for two references must include one teacher, but can also include employer, coach, community leaders etc.

Students are encouraged to see a Guidance counsellor if they have any questions about the course.

Summer Learning **Pilot Innovation Course**

Description

Youth Innovation By Design focuses on ways in which innovators identify problems, see them as opportunities, generate ideas, and organize resources to develop and take successful solutions forward into the world, both for-profit and not-for-profit. Students will be encouraged to use a variety of design thinking techniques, including the Innovation, Creativity, and Entrepreneurship (ICE) Toolkit to develop and grow their ideas. They will consider the ethical and legal implications of decisions, the breadth of roles in innovation culture as well as sustainability models. In support of both group and individualized projects, students will be introduced to, and taught how to connect with, local and global ecosystems. Student learning throughout the course will be supported by guest speakers and mentors provided through a collaboration with York University's Markham Innovation Centre (YU-MIC) and Innovation York.

- Applications will be screened for eligibility based on:
 - no conflicts with taking the selected grade 12 IDC credit;
 - references that provide strong support;
 - strong student rationale for being a good candidate for this pilot
- Eligible students will then be randomly chosen and all applicants will be informed via e-mail.
