Guidance News

Each year, the Ministry of Education requires that all school boards complete an exit survey for grade 12 students as part of the Student Success Strategy. The survey questions provided by the Ministry are used to assess how well the *Creating Pathways to Success* policy and program is with helping students to develop the knowledge and skills they need for effective education and career/life planning.

During the week of May 13-17, Grade 12 students will be provided time during their period 3 class to complete the survey. Students who do not have a period 3 class can complete it during their lunch (using their own device or using a school computer), or at home. Students will be able to access the survey via *My Pathway Planner*.

Step-by-step instructions have been provided below. Any student with questions or requiring help can visit the Guidance office.

Students will be able to access the survey through 'My Pathway Planner' account by doing the following:

- Go to the York Region District School Board Website (<u>http://www.yrdsb.ca/Pages/default.aspx</u>);
- 2. Click on the "My Pathway Planner" button;
- 3. Log into their account using their YRDSB credentials;
- 4. Click on the "Complete Survey" button in the blue banner on the homepage
- 5. Complete the survey questions in the Google Form that opens (students must be logged into their GAPPS account).

In addition to the Ministry Survey, UHS also conducts their own exit survey. Grade 12 students will use the following bit.ly link to access the survey (N.B. students must be logged into their GAPPS account). http://bit.ly/2HaqifR

Special Education

SPECIAL EDUCATION Students, Parents and Guardians: Thinking about, Applying to and Planning on Attending Colleges and University

School Assistance for Special Education extends beyond High School in both College and University. Access to Special Education services in College and University is very different than high school, after accepting a program students must "Self Advocate" and register themselves with the appropriate offices as early as possible. Colleges and Universities require students to provide copies of relevant documents (IEP, psycho-educational assessments, medical documentation, etc.). In some cases additional documents or testing may be requested.

The language used in Post Secondary institutions also differs greatly from high school, there are no IEPs (Individual Education Plans) and instead students are provided Letters of Accommodation that they must share with their Instructors and Professors. The accommodations provided at the College and University level may be significantly different than those received in high school.





There are programs offered the summer before students start at some institutions to help students transition to post secondary and gain an understanding of how Special Education services will work for them.
