Culminating/Exam Dates

The last day of Grade 12 classes is **Friday, June 16**. Grade 12 exams begin on Monday, **June 19** and run until Friday, **June 23**.

The last day of classes for Grades 9, 10, and 11 is Tuesday, **June 20**. Exams for grades 9, 10 and 11 begin on Wednesday, **June 21** and run until Tuesday, **June 27**.

Grade 12 exams begin early to ensure that all grade 12 marks are submitted prior to graduation.

All students are expected to be present for their culminating/exam tasks taking place during the exam schedule.

June 28 is exam review day. Attendance is taken on this day. This day is usually run as a condensed schedule (i.e. shortened periods) where students have the opportunity to see their final culminating/exam task results.

Grade 12: An Important Message About Your GAPPS Account:

This is a message for all Graduates and any student leaving YRDSB at the end of *June, 2023*. Students who wish to keep work that has been saved on the YRDSB Google Drive (GAPPS account) will need to download it as soon as possible - **no later than the end of July 2023**. They will not have access to this account after this time.

Instructions on how to Download your Google Data:

- 1. Select the Google Apps and Services you want to export your data and documents from, and select the option to receive the file as a download via email (depending on the size of your Google account, this could take several hours). Use the .zip file option.
- 2. Once the Google Takeout email arrives, use the links to download your archived data and documents to the personal computer, USB/external drive and/or the personal Google Drive that you wish.
- 3. You can "unzip" the archives and then upload the data and documents to a new personal Google Account or use the files and documents in Microsoft Office or other applications.

Student Parking Reminders

Dear Students and Families,

Please keep in mind the following parking procedures:

Students must reapply every semester for a new parking pass. Please note there are limited spots available for student parking. After a student has completed the application process and upon approval a \$20.00 deposit is required through School Cash Online. This deposit will be refunded at the end of each semester provided that the parking pass is returned to the main office. Students are only permitted to park along the outside portables. Please refer to this map for student parking location. Students must display their parking pass clearly on their dashboard. Students are responsible for all City issued parking tickets.

Please note: We have reached our maximum for student parking passes for the 2022-2023 school year.

2023 Summer Program

Program overview

The Come Up summer program is a unique in-person course offered to self-identifying Black students in the York Region District School Board. It also includes guest speakers, field trips, lunch and swag.

Students entering grade 9 will earn a Civics and Careers (GLC2O/CHV2O) credit.

Students entering Grade 10 will earn a Black History (CHE3O) credit. This credit can be used to fulfill the grade 10 compulsory history credit.

- Do you self-identify as Black?
- Are you a YRDSB Student?
- Are you interested in earning a high school credit?
