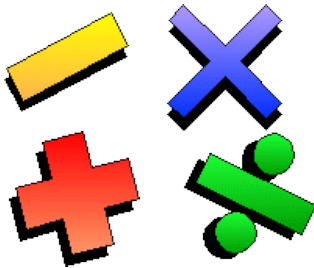
Wellness Wednesday
