#### **Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT)**

Attention to all students who will be writing the OSSLT this semester – this includes all eligible Grade 10s, previously unsuccessful and potential graduates who have not yet passed the OSSLT – this semester's OSSLT will take place during Period 3 on the following dates:

November 21/November 22 November 23/November 24 November 28/November 29 November 30/December 1

The OSSLT will take place over two days during Period 3. Students will be assigned to one of the groupings and are expected to attend both days, as the test is split up into two sessions. Students and families will receive specific details as to when they will be writing the OSSLT very soon. Students are encouraged to keep practicing for the test (many exercises can be found on the OSSLT Google Classroom) and to check their GAPPS email for more information.

### Questions and Answers from our last School Council Meeting

My daughter entered grade 9 this year, and I found there are no sports classes for 1st semester, and also no recess or other activities to consume their energy. Now she has become weak, and I am worried about her health. Can we have more physical activities for all students?	Students can participate in sports teams. A variety of sports are offered throughout the school year. Information about tryouts for teams are communicated via morning announcements, the student life webpage and through the Wolfpack app. Students can also check in with our Phys Ed Department with questions.
I would like to know how and when students can choose special courses, for example: my son would like to study business and technology.	Course selection for the 2023-2024 school year will begin in February. Students and parent/guardians will be provided with information regarding the process and will have access to the courses that are being offered for the school year. A presentation for parents/guardians will take place during the January school council meeting.
When will the cafeteria be open?	We are currently unsure about a specific date. Information will be shared as it becomes available.
In regards to mental health, I know my child would be more enthused to come to school if he was able to join a program only I've not seen where or how he can join. Please guide me in where to find what is available and how to join.	UHS offers a wide variety of clubs. Students can view which clubs are currently running by visiting the student life website or through the Wolfpack app. A clubs fair took place on October 26 and a list of all clubs and teacher advisors can be found in the Parent Bulletin.
Supporting Mental Health: It is important to plan with the awareness that many students have been participating in online learning throughout the intermediate grades and beyond. The pressures of the pandemic combined with decreased school engagement can have a large impact on the mental health and wellbeing of students and staff. In addition, students may be lacking some learning skills needed to support exam prep, pathway planning etc. Some may be feeling the shock of an intense start!	The Guidance department provided a study skills workshop for all students (October 19every period) to help students prepare for exams/tests. The study skills workshop also focused on memorization strategies, a check list for handling stress, exam strategies (exam preparation, during the exam and exam format information), as well as what to do after the exam. This presentation will be posted to the UHS website, under the Guidance tab.

### House of Commons Page Program Recruitment Campaign

We are pleased to announce the official launch of the recruitment campaign for the House of Commons Page Program.

Each year, we recruit 40 bilingual students graduating from high schools and CEGEPs from across Canada to participate in the House of Commons Page Program. Pages work directly on the floor of the House of Commons and are responsible for a wide range of tasks related to Chamber activities. This provides them with the opportunity to broaden their knowledge of Parliament by playing a role in the rich traditions of the Canadian parliamentary system. Our recruitment campaign for the 2023-2024 academic year is taking place from **September 26 to November 6, 2022**.

To be considered, candidates must submit a curriculum vitae (maximum of two pages), a cover letter which includes detailed examples clearly demonstrating how they meet the education, experience and asset prerequisites listed on the notice of job opportunity, and a proof of enrolment confirming their current or past student status (e.g. unofficial transcript, official transcript or report card from a high school or CEGEP).





To be selected, candidates must be starting full-time or part-time post-secondary studies in **September 2023** at the University of Ottawa, Carleton University, Saint Paul University, Université du Québec en Outaouais, Collège La Cité or Algonquin College. Successful candidates will be required to reside in the National Capital Region during their year of employment as a Page. We encourage you to visit our <u>website</u> to learn more.

### **Digital Storytelling Initiative**


