UHS OSSLT Administration Window: November 18 - November 29, Period 3 and Period 4

November 18 - November 29, 2024 starting from period 3, Unionville HS students who have not fulfilled their literacy requirement for the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) will write the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) for two days. It will also be written by students who were previously eligible but have not yet written the test or who were unsuccessful on their previous attempts.

To help students prepare for the OSSLT, teachers will provide OSSLT preparation sessions in their grade 10 classrooms on November 11 period 1, November 12 period 2, November 13 period 3 and November 14 period 5. Students who are **not in a grade 10 classroom** at those times can go to the practice session in the **library**.

In a separate email in student GAPPS accounts, students will receive the date, time, and classroom location where they will write the OSSLT. More details will be sent to their GAPPS accounts.

Unionville High School Clinic is scheduled for Monday, November 4th.



The Chamber of Red Thread Project By Visual Art Grade 12 Students

The Chamber of Red Thread is on display at the <u>WongAvery Asia</u> <u>Pacific Peace Museum (APPM)</u> due to the generosity of Shane Clodd, the amazing Head of Visual Arts, Unionville High School York Region District School Board. It was moved from the Aga Khan on Friday June 14, 2024 when a Seat at the Table exhibition ended.

Thanks to Tracy-Mae Chambers, Metis artist, who worked with the students and Mr. Shane Clodd.

Thanks to the brilliant creativity and storytelling of the **Grade 12 students** in his class, bringing together Metis art, technology, mathematics, and the Chinese cultural symbolism of the Red Thread as counter narratives to anti-Asian racism.

To quote the students: "Traditionally, the concept of the Red Thread signified the unseen ties that connect us to those with whom we shared significant life lessons. Beyond its individual symbolism, the Red Thread extended to encompass connections within families, communities, and the collective whole of human beings. It represents the threads of fate that weave through our lives, intertwining our stories and influencing our paths. This concept resonated universally, reflecting the intricate tapestry of human experience within the grand narrative of existence."



Semester 1 Midterm Reporting - All students

York Region District School Board will be issuing electronic copies of the **Semester 1 midterm report cards** between **November 18-20**. The electronic copy will be available to parents/caregivers through the **new family portal**, and students will continue to access through their GAPPs account. Instructions will be sent out by email to both parents/caregivers and to students prior to distribution.



Full Disclosure for Grade 11 and Grade 12 Courses

For the 2024-2025 school year, the course withdrawal date (Full Disclosure) will be at least 5 instructional days from the last possible date the mid-semester report is issued. **The Full Disclosure date for Grade 11 and Grade 12 courses is November 27**. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course on or prior to November 27, then the course and mark will not be recorded on the Ontario Student Transcript. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course after the Full Disclosure date, a withdrawal (W) is entered in the credit column, and the student's mark in the course at the time of withdrawal will be recorded as a percentage in the achievement column of the transcript.





Family Portal and Contact Information

York Region District School Board is looking forward to launching a family portal later this year. The portal will make it easier for you to access information about your child's education in a secure and accessible way. To access the portal, it will be essential that the school has an updated email address for you. Please contact the school office if you need to update your email address. We look forward to sharing more information about this initiative with you soon.

If any of your contact information has changed, including phone number, address, or email address, please contact the school office. This is important in case of emergencies and to ensure you receive important school communications.

School Start-Up Forms Reminder

You must sign in to your child's student GAPPS account to complete the form.

In case you have not yet completed school start-up forms, please submit them as soon as possible as they contain permissions and consents. The forms can be foundat https://startupforms.yrdsb.ca/. Translated versions are also available.

<u>Tips are available</u> on the Board website if you need additional information on how to login to the Student GAPPS account to complete the forms.

You must complete a separate form for each child attending school. Please ensure you logout of one student account before logging into another.

If you'd prefer to complete the forms on paper or have questions about the information in the forms, please contact the school office.

Secondary schoolstudents must also complete the secondaryschool student form at https://startupforms.yrdsb.ca/students. They would have received this link in their studentGAPPS account.



OUAC and OCAS Upload for Potential Graduates

Semester 1 midterm marks will be shared with OCAS and OUAC on **November 15**. Students in Grade 11 and 12 courses will be notified of their report card mark by their classroom teacher by **November 11**. Potential graduates who are applying to an Ontario college and/or university who are planning to drop a course are encouraged to connect with their guidance counsellor in advance of these dates. Guidance appointments can be booked through <u>Teachassist</u>.

We recognize that you and your child may have questions regarding this information. If it is helpful for you to connect with a staff member from the school, please contact the Guidance Department to discuss your questions.

Please review the timelines below:

October 10	Deadline for potential graduates who are not planning on applying to an Ontario college or university to notify their Guidance Counsellor if they do not want their information shared with OCAS/OUAC this school year.
October 15-18	Students will receive a secure communication in their GAPPS email which provides information needed for their applications, including their OEN (required for college applications only), school MIDENT# (BSID).
November 11	Teachers will share mid semester mark updates with students in Grade 11 and 12 courses.
November 11-14	Potential graduates applying to an Ontario college or university that are planning to drop a course, and do not wish to have the course mark shared with OUAC/OCAS are advised to connect with their Guidance Counsellor by November 17.
November 15	School will upload all Semester 1 midterm and/or final marks (for quadmester courses) for all grade 11 and 12 courses to OUAC and OCAS
November 27	This is the full disclosure date, which is the final day that a student, in a Grade 11 or 12 course, may drop a course in order that it not be recorded on the Ontario Student Transcript.


Attendance

Daytime Appointments: Send a note or call the office – students must **be signed out through the main office**

Extended Absences: If the student is taking three and more days of absence, the Student must complete an **Extended Absence Form**, signed by parents and your child's teachers. - How accomodations can be used to support the student in college/university


