York Region District School Board will be issuing electronic copies of the **Semester 1 midterm report cards** between **November 18-20**.

The electronic copy will be available to parents/caregivers through the <u>New Family Dashboard</u>, and students will continue to access through their **GAPPS account**. Instructions will be sent out by email to both parents/caregivers and to students prior to distribution.



The family dashboard is an online dashboard that will give you secure access to information and applications related to your child's education. In this first phase, the dashboard will include secure access to report cards and links to useful information for parents/guardians.




# How do parents/guardians access support to register for and use the Dashboard?

## UHS OSSLT Administration Window: November 18 - November 29, Period 3 and Period 4

**November 18 - November 29, 2024** starting from period 3, Unionville HS students who have not fulfilled their literacy requirement for the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) will write the Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) for two days. It will also be written by students who were previously eligible but have not yet written the test or who were unsuccessful on their previous attempts.

In a separate email in student GAPPS accounts, students will receive the date, time, and classroom location where they will write the OSSLT. More details will be sent to their GAPPS accounts.

### **Bullying - We Can All Help Stop It**

"Bullying is behaviour that can be repeated or occur one time and can be carried out by an individual or group of individuals. Bullying can occur in situations where there are real or perceived power imbalances between individuals or groups, and may be a symptom of racism, classism, homophobia, sexism, religious discrimination, ethnic discrimination or other forms of bias and discrimination. Bullying can also be based on, but not limited to, body size, appearance, abilities, or other real or perceived factors. Perceptions about differences are often based on stereotypes perpetuated in broader society."

The Government of Ontario has designated the third week of November as <u>Bullying Awareness</u> and <u>Prevention Week.</u> During the week of Monday, November 18 to Friday, November 22, 2024, we are encouraged to specifically and intentionally address bullying issues, promote healthy relationships and support a positive school climate where all members of the school community feel safe, included, accepted, and engaged in positive behaviours and interactions.


### **Attendance**

**Daytime Appointments**: Send a note or call the office – students must **be signed out through the main office** 

**Extended Absences**: If the student is taking three and more days of absence, the Student must complete an **Extended Absence Form**, signed by parents and your child's teachers. The form is to be returned to the attendance office prior to the absence. Please avoid scheduling vacations during school.

For the 2024-2025 school year, the course withdrawal date (Full Disclosure) will be at least 5 instructional days from the last possible date the mid-semester report is issued. **The Full Disclosure date for Grade 11 and Grade 12 courses is November 27**. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course on or prior to November 27, then the course and mark will not be recorded on the Ontario Student Transcript. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course after the Full Disclosure date, a withdrawal (W) is entered in the credit column, and the student's mark in the course at the time of withdrawal will be recorded as a percentage in the achievement column of the transcript.

# **OUAC and OCAS Upload for Potential Graduates**

Semester 1 midterm marks will be shared with OCAS and OUAC on **November 15**. Students in Grade 11 and 12 courses will be notified of their report card mark by their classroom teacher by **November 11**. Potential graduates who are applying to an Ontario college and/or university who are planning to drop a course are encouraged to connect with their guidance counsellor in advance of these dates. Guidance appointments can be booked through <u>Teachassist</u>.

We recognize that you and your child may have questions regarding this information. If it is helpful for you to connect with a staff member from the school, please contact the Guidance Department to discuss your questions.

Please review the timelines below:

October 10	Deadline for potential graduates who are not planning on applying to an Ontario college or university to notify their Guidance Counsellor if they do not want their information shared with OCAS/OUAC this school year.	
October 15-18	Students will receive a secure communication in their GAPPS email which provides information needed for their applications, including their OEN (required for college applications only), school MIDENT# (BSID).	
November 11	Teachers will share mid semester mark updates with students in Grade 11 and 12 courses.	
November 11-14	Potential graduates applying to an Ontario college or university that are planning to drop a course, and do not wish to have the course mark shared with OUAC/OCAS are advised to connect with their Guidance Counsellor by November 17.	
November 15	School will upload all Semester 1 midterm and/or final marks (for quadmester courses) for all grade 11 and 12 courses to OUAC and OCAS	
November 27	This is the full disclosure date, which is the final day that a student, in a Grade 11 or 12 course, may drop a course in order that it not be recorded on the Ontario Student Transcript.
