MESSAGE FROM THE GUIDANCE

FULL DISCLOSURE MEMO

Attention Students who are applying to post-secondary institutions. Please read the message regarding full disclosure

Full disclosure: "If a student withdraws from a course more than five (5) days after the reporting period, a withdrawal (W) is entered in the credit column and the student's mark at the time of withdrawal is recorded as a percentage in the achievement column of the transcript".

Full disclosure applies to all grade 11 and 12 courses that a student is registered in for longer than "5 days following the first provincial report card". Our report card distribution date this year is November 16th and, therefore, our full disclosure date is November 26th, therefore all courses continued past **November 26th**, and marks earned to date in these courses, must be shown (fully disclosed) on your official transcript.

Please note, this year report cards are being issued four working days before <u>OCAS</u> (<u>Ontario Colleges Application Service</u>) upload needs to be completed. As a result, if you are applying to an <u>Ontario College</u> and you do not want a course to be transferred to OCAS, your task is to start the process to drop the course as soon as possible by making an appointment with your Guidance Counsellor.

There is a process and specific criteria in place that must be followed for students to be considered to drop a course

Summary of dates:


November 21 – deadline for students applying to a <u>college</u> to see alpha counsellor to drop a course

November 22 – deadline for completed drop form for students applying to post-secondary due to Guidance by 3:00 p.m.

November 22 - transfer of mid-term marks to **OCAS**

November 26 - official full disclosure date

Teachers have been asked to share with grade 12 students' mid-term marks the week of November 12th to enable students to make any decisions relating to full disclosure.

YRDSB Arts Camp 2019 Counsellor or Counsellor-In-Training (CIT) Position Application

Arts Camp 2019 is scheduled from May 25th to June 1st, 2019. There are a limited number of Counsellor and CIT positions at camp. Those students not selected for one of these leadership positions will be encouraged to apply for a camper position.

Application Process:

- Only students in Grades 10-12 may apply for a Counsellor or CIT position;
- Counsellor applicants must have completed the Arts Camp CIT Program and/or an equivalent training program;
- The Counsellor and CIT program are positions of responsibility and require students to demonstrate leadership in their schools and/or communities;
- Applicants must complete the online form <u>Leadership Application</u> in its entirety. Please ensure you are logged into your gapps account.
- In order to prepare answers for the required questions within the application, applicants may view the application in its entirety before responding through their @gapps.yrdsb.ca account Leadership Application Full View;
- Applicants must also upload a current resume in PDF when prompted in the online form;
- Students require parental/guardian consent and support of a referring teacher and school administrator to apply for a Leadership position at Arts Camp;
- There is no limit to the number of applications submitted from a particular school provided that each Counsellor/CIT applicant has met the following 4 criteria:
 - o Demonstrates positive character in school;
 - o Demonstrates positive behaviour in school;
 - o Would benefit from and positively contribute, as a leader, to an arts program in an inclusive community; and
 - o Is prepared and mature enough to spend a week away from home and school.
- A confirmation email will be sent to all applicants once they have completed the online form;
- An online reference form will be sent to referring teachers and Principal/VPs for each applicant. Each student's application is dependent upon a positive reference from all parties.

The deadline for all Counsellor and CIT applications is:

Thursday, November 22nd, 2018

(Payment and full registration for camp will be arranged once the leadership applicant selection has been finalized).



EQAO INFORMATION

EQAO Summary 2017-2018

Each year, students in grades 9 and 10 participate in EQAO assessments. In grade 9, students complete an EQAO Mathematics Assessment towards the end of the semester in which they take Grade 9 Academic or Applied Math. The results of this assessment account for 5% of a student's final mark. In grade 10, students complete the OSSLT (Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test) in the spring. Successful completion of the OSSLT (or the OSSLC course) is a requirement for graduation.

Students who completed one of these assessments last year received an individual student summary with their results.

Highlights of Grade 9 EQAO Mathematics

Applied Courses:

63% of students who completed the assessment scored at or above provincial standard (level 3 and 4)

Academic Courses:

93% of students who completed the assessment scored at or above provincial standard (level 3 and 4)

Highlights of OSSLT:

A passing grade on the OSSLT is 75%. There are two groups of students who write the OSSLT: Grade 10 students, and Previously Eligible students. Previously Eligible students are those who were absent or deferred in the previous school year.

Grade 10 Students:

- 94% of students who completed the assessment were successful Previously Eligible Students:
- 62% of students who completed the assessment were successful
