

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#### **After School Literacy Program**

The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT) will be taking place in the fall between November 2 and December 7, 2022. The OSSLT is a graduation requirement for all students in the province of Ontario.

Grade 10 students and those who were previously unsuccessful will either be writing the OSSLT for the first time, or retaking it this year. Students who are writing the OSSLT this year are strongly encouraged to join the After School Literacy Program that begins the week of October 17 for extra support and preparation. Emails were sent to all potential OSSLT writers.

The After School Literacy Program will consist of ten 1.5 hour sessions for a total of 15 hours. The programs will take place in person at UHS from 3:15pm - 4:45pm. The programs will run from the week of October 17 - November 18, 2022 and they will take place twice a week (ex. Mondays & Wednesdays or Tuesdays & Thursdays). Based on student and teacher availability, students will be placed in one of the programs. Once the sign-up form closes, students will be placed into a program that suits their availability.

Please have your child complete the Google Form using their YRDSB GAPPS email address. The Google Form will close on **Tuesday, October 11, 2022 at 12pm.** 

These workshops have been designed to support students achieving success on the OSSLT this year. Teachers will provide intensive practice with the reading and writing tasks, further developing the required literacy skills in preparation for the test.




#### **Prayer/Meditation Space Request**


#### SHSM (Specialist High Schools Major) Information Session

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
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#### **Peer Tutoring**

#### York Region 2022 Anti-Human Trafficking Conference




