Take Our Kids to Work Day

Take Our Kids to Work (TOKW) Day is a unique initiative designed to provide Grade 9 students with invaluable insights into the world of work. It aims to assist students in considering future career paths by offering them the opportunity to observe a work environment for one day. On **Wednesday, November 1**, Grade 9 students will have the chance to spend the day at a workplace of their parent/guardian, relative, friend or volunteer. (Please note: UHS does not organize job shadowing placements for this day) It is a day dedicated to fostering a deeper understanding of various career options and pathways. The Students Commission of Canada is the new organization that supports this program and offers resources for <u>educators, students and families</u>. The 2023 TOKW Theme is "Everyone Belongs Here!"
