#### Friday, November 1st: PJ Day


- To prepare for the weekend, dress up in your comfiest pajama set!

Beyond its individual symbolism, the Red Thread extended to encompass connections within families, communities, and the collective whole of human beings. It represents the threads of fate that weave through our lives, intertwining our stories and influencing our paths. This concept resonated universally, reflecting the intricate tapestry of human experience within the grand narrative of existence."



York Region District School Board will be issuing electronic copies of the **Semester 1 midterm report cards** between **November 18-20**. The electronic copy will be available to parents/caregivers through the **new family portal**, and students will continue to access through their GAPPs account. Instructions will be sent out by email to both parents/caregivers and to





students prior to distribution.

## Full Disclosure for Grade 11 and Grade 12 Courses

For the 2024-2025 school year, the course withdrawal date (Full Disclosure) will be at least 5 instructional days from the last possible date the mid-semester report is issued. **The Full Disclosure date for Grade 11 and Grade 12 courses is November 27**. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course on or prior to November 27, then the course and mark will not be recorded on the Ontario Student Transcript. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course after the Full Disclosure date, a withdrawal (W) is entered in the credit column, and the student's mark in the course at the time of withdrawal will be recorded as a percentage in the achievement column of the transcript.





## **Family Portal and Contact Information**

You must sign in to your child's student GAPPS account to complete the form.



## Message from York Region Public Health: Immunization Clinics for Gr. 11 and Gr. 12

#### Only for Gr. 12 students:


In **November 4, 2024**, Unionville High School will have an additional clinic scheduled to offer vaccines to our **Gr. 12** students who are **at risk of school suspension** under the Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA). The immunization clinics for Gr. 12 students are convenient opportunities for students to get caught up on missing vaccine doses prior to the school suspension process planned for their grade in November.

For the Gr. 12 students: Families will receive mail notification from **YRPH** in October if the student is at risk of impending suspension due to missing routine immunizations, and to advise them of an in-school vaccine clinic.

As always, students who missed an in-school clinic may visit their **health care provider** or book an appointment at a <u>Public Health community immunization clinic</u> to obtain any missing routine immunizations. Please note that any families can reach us at 1-877-464-9675 about any questions related to **vaccines, suspensions and the clinics**.

## Only for Gr. 11 students:

**Tuesday February 18, 2025**, YRPH will offer UHS a catch-up immunization clinics only to students in **Gr. 11**.







## OUAC and OCAS Upload for Potential Graduates

Semester 1 midterm marks will be shared with OCAS and OUAC on **November 15**. Students in Grade 11 and 12 courses will be notified of their report card mark by their classroom teacher by **November 11**. Potential graduates who are applying to an Ontario college and/or university who are planning to drop a course are encouraged to connect with their guidance counsellor in advance of these dates. Guidance appointments can be booked through <u>Teachassist</u>.

We recognize that you and your child may have questions regarding this information. If it is helpful for you to connect with a staff member from the school, please contact the Guidance Department to discuss your questions.

Please review the timelines below:

October 10	Deadline for potential graduates who are not planning on applying to an Ontario college or university to notify their Guidance Counsellor if they do not want their information shared with OCAS/OUAC this school year.
October 15-18	Students will receive a secure communication in their GAPPS email which provides information needed for their applications, including their OEN (required for college applications only), school MIDENT# (BSID).
November 11	Teachers will share mid semester mark updates with students in Grade 11 and 12 courses.
November 11-14	Potential graduates applying to an Ontario college or university that are planning to drop a course, and do not wish to have the course mark shared with OUAC/OCAS are advised to connect with their Guidance Counsellor by November 17.
November 15	School will upload all Semester 1 midterm and/or final marks (for quadmester courses) for all grade 11 and 12 courses to OUAC and OCAS
November 27	This is the full disclosure date, which is the final day that a student, in a Grade 11 or 12 course, may drop a course in order that it not be recorded on the Ontario Student Transcript.






