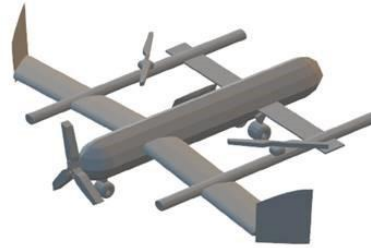

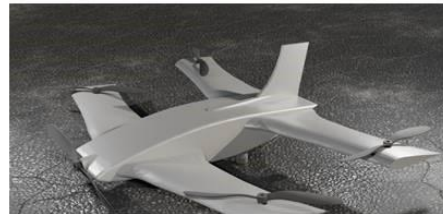

Summer Co-Op Opportunity

Continuing Education in Collaboration with Curriculum & Instruction Services is offering several Pathway program opportunities this summer, including: Dual Credits, Youth Innovation by Design IDC Course, and in person Co-op (1 and 2 credit programs). Spaces are very limited in each program and will be decided on a first-come-first serve basis. Grade 12 students requiring 1 credit to graduate will be given priority in 1 and 2 Credit Co-op programs.

Community Involvement Hours

Now is a great time for students to work on completing Community Involvement Hours. Students are reminded that they must have their activity pre-approved prior to completing the activity. A special reminder to Grade 12 graduating students that the deadline to submit completed Community Involvement hours by June 1st. Students may join the 'UHS Volunteer Google Classroom' (enrolment key: **gsrz264**) or meet with a Guidance counsellor to learn about volunteer opportunities.

A reminder for the 2021-2022 school year, the required number of hours for community involvement activities will be reduced from 40 hours to a minimum of 20 hours for graduating students. This is consistent with changes made in the 2020-21 school year. All other students are required to complete the 40 required hours.

At the principal's discretion, the following activities will be deemed eligible for all secondary students for their community involvement activities in the 2021-22 school year:

- Activities that take place during the time allotted for the instructional program on a school day (e.g., walking a younger neighbour or sibling to and from school, helping younger siblings with their homework)
- Activities that include up to 10 hours of paid work, with the requirement to complete a reflection exercise indicating how their work contributed to service for others (e.g., grocery work during the pandemic). This will need to be completed by clicking on the following link: CI Reflection Form: <https://bit.ly/ciReflection>
- Activities that consist of duties normally performed in the home (e.g., students could help an elderly relative with errands, provide after-school care for a sibling)

Please note: Volunteer opportunities differ from field trips and are communicated through our Guidance Department's Google Classroom or Volunteering Bulletin Board. The YRDSB is not responsible for transportation or supervision when students make contact with community members to arrange volunteer opportunities.

A classroom teacher may not sign the community involvement hours form for opportunities taking place off-site. Teachers may sign forms for events taking place in the school under their supervision only (e.g. student secretary on parent-teacher interview night). While teachers can inform students of volunteer opportunities and direct them to visit the Guidance office, teachers should not call community members to arrange these volunteer opportunities. Opportunities provided in the community must be arranged by the student or parent/guardian and the outside venue.

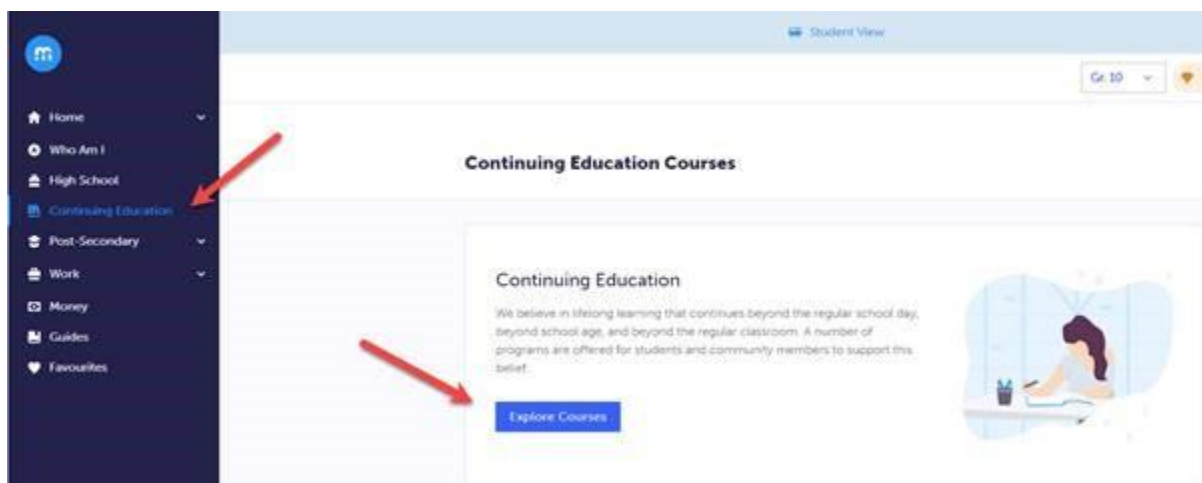

City of Markham Ticketing

Please be aware that the school driveways and parking areas are very busy at Town Centre Blvd and Warden in the morning (8:00-8:30 am) and in the afternoon (2:00pm-2:35pm). In the morning, please do not park in staff spaces at the Warden entrance. At Town Centre Blvd, you are advised not to park for an extended period in the "No Idle Cars" zone. This is also a Fire Route. This zone is intended only for "quick pick-up or drop-off." Cars that are parked or left idling in this zone will be ticketed by the City of Markham. As well, parking passes are required for all cars in our school lots. Cars without parking passes in our school lots will be ticketed by the City of Markham. COVID-19 Reminders

As you may be aware, the [Government of Ontario](#) announced their plan to lift many of the COVID-19 health and safety measures in public spaces and schools. Effective Monday, March 21, 2022:

- Students, staff members and school visitors will no longer be required to wear masks in school. Individuals who feel more comfortable or who are advised to wear a mask can continue to wear a mask and will be supported in doing so.

- Staff and students will not be required to complete the screening confirmation form each day. Students, staff members and visitors should continue to review and adhere to the [COVID-19 School and Child-Care Screening Tool](#) (please click on Check for Symptoms Daily), prior to entering the school daily. The screening tool has been updated to reflect new isolation requirements.
- Students will no longer be required to remain in cohorts or to practice physical distancing.

In addition, effective March 14, requirements for staff members to complete vaccination attestations or mandatory testing has been removed.

Hand washing and cleaning protocols will remain in place. In addition, we will continue to follow our current ventilation practices.

Current measures remain in effect until March 21, 2022, including mask requirements for all students in Kindergarten to Grade 12, and the completion of the screening confirmation form.

We appreciate that students and families may have mixed reactions to this announcement. Our educators will continue to support student well-being as these changes are implemented, and work to ensure all of our students feel safe, welcome and supported. Please also be assured that we will continue to consult with public health to ensure we are taking all appropriate measures to protect the health and safety of our students, staff members and families.

Unionville High School continues to encourage all members of the UHS community to wear masks as they see fit, while respecting the choices of all staff, students and visitors who enter our building. We are also encouraging all members of the UHS community to observe proper hand hygiene - this means sanitizing and washing your hands frequently.

About Us

A small core team of 5 amazing women enable the work of FOTH.

We started out meeting in person, every Thursday morning, at Boxgrove Community Center in Markham. When the pandemic hit, we stopped offering in-person sessions and in January of 2021, we went virtual with the membership. We currently meet over Zoom every Thursday evening and offer free sessions on a broad range of topics: Health and Fitness, Importance of Self Care, Wills & Estate Planning (Powers of Attorney), Naturopathic Medicine, Family Law and Changes to the Divorce Act. We also hosted workshops by Yellow Brick House on self-esteem and anxiety management, and invited Victim Services of Durham Region to speak to the group about Domestic Human Trafficking. Hair care, makeup, financial management and life coaching advice also topped our list. Recently, we invited York Region District School Board's Mental Health Lead Patricia Marra-Stapleton to speak about The ABC's of Mental Health.

Membership

We are all different and are on different journeys in our lives so our sessions and the resources we offer cover a breadth of topics. We do not charge membership fees and welcome new members from every walk of life and in all communities. Most of our membership is local but we have had speakers present from as far as Vancouver and Ottawa regions. Our mission is to share our collective knowledge and build engagement as a way to support women. We have become a free and accessible resource hub to women in our community.

Experience

Some of our proudest moments include being interviewed by CTV's Janice Golding and the story happened to air on International Women's Day in 2021.

We hosted our first (and very successful) public event on December 2, 2021 at the Mandarin Restaurant Boxgrove. Tickets sold out early and we had an unforgettable evening of food, entertainment and special guest presentations. We hosted dignitaries including the Deputy Mayor of Markham and Ward Councillors, community partners, business partners, media personalities and York Regional Police. We held a successful silent auction with all proceeds supporting community programs at Family Services of York Region.

2022 Program

We are launching our Youth Leadership Program – Leaders in Training - to our communities. We have learned from our work with school councils, parents and community partners that there is work to be done. We see a need to build up our youth. Our program will focus on mentoring and building self-esteem and confidence – showing our youth how to lead so that they can step up and lead others. We recognize nutritious eating, the benefits of physical activity, mental health and well-being (the importance of self-care), professional attire, dress & makeup, resume & interview skills, financial responsibility, business acumen, to name a few, are all important to youth leadership. We want our youth to be empowered so that they can advocate for themselves when it comes to dealing with life's challenges, including situations of conflict, bullying, etc.

Leaders in Training will focus on teaching youth to own their education and their lives. They also learn early on a social responsibility to others, in particular those in need. We recognize that youth leadership is critical to respecting cultural differences in schools, acknowledging economic disparity in our communities, protecting vulnerable groups, etc. Increasingly, we are seeing more bullying in our schools, low self-esteem and depression among youth, eating disorders and poor mental health, all of which are contributing factors to larger societal problems like violence, gang involvement and domestic human trafficking. We look forward to having conversations with our community partners and stakeholders so that we can move forward together, and support each other in making our communities a safer, brighter, and more hopeful place for our children and their families.
