Update to COVID Screening Tool

Updates to the COVID-19 Screening Tool

On the recommendation of the Office of the Chief Medical Officer of Health, updates have been made to align with current guidance and to provide clarity on isolation requirements for confirmed and presumed positive cases, and their household members and close contacts.

For those completing the screening tool who are fully vaccinated and/or 11 years old or younger, the screening tool will ask for symptoms and test results in the last 5 days. Those completing who are 12 years old or older and not fully vaccinated or immunocompromised will complete the screening tool using a 10 day measuring period.

Schools should have an **updated**, downloaded and printed copy of the screening tool accessible for visitors reference.

Course Selection Information

To implement further improvements, there will be scheduled downtime and server maintenance this weekend from 10 pm EST Friday, Feb 18 to 6am EST Saturday, Feb 19.

Students can begin submitting their course selection starting on Wednesday February 16 at 9am and course selection will close on Friday February 25 at 4pm using My Pathway Planner. Please note this is <u>not</u> first come, first serve, so we ask that students carefully consider their course selections and consult with teachers, Guidance Counsellors and their parents/guardians prior to submitting. Once they submit their course, they are locked in.

To support students with the course selection process, the Guidance Department has put together pre-recorded presentations and PowerPoints for each grade. This past Thursday in Period 2 classes, students were provided time to view these presentations. They were also provided an enrolment key to a Google Classroom where they can revisit the presentation if required (enrolment key: us43vmc). These same presentations can also be accessed <u>here</u>, (select the left side bar tab: course selection).

In addition, to help students learn more about specific courses offered at UHS, departments have shared dates/times and google meet links for students to virtually meet with them. This link can be found on the Google Classroom (students must be logged into their GAPPS account).

Students who are graduating this year and not returning to UHS must select 'Not Returning' in my Pathway planner.

A new feature this year requires parents/guardians to approve their student's course selection. Upon submitting courses in My Pathway Planner, students will be required to enter in the email of a parent/guardian. Parents/guardians will be able to view the student's course submissions and can either approve or reject the courses. Guidance Counsellors will be reviewing these submissions on a daily basis.

Should your student require support with course selection, please have them schedule an appointment in TeachAssist with their alpha Guidance Counsellor.

Dear Parents/Guardians,

As part of a partnership between YRDSB and Renewed Computer Technology (RCT), families with children enrolled in our Board have the opportunity to purchase quality-refurbished computers at a reduced cost. Applicants must live in Ontario, have a student enrolled at the school and either receive government assistance payments or qualify as a limited income earner under the limited income cut-off standards*.

Below is a limited income grid for your reference.

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This year, there are different packages available for purchase. Please reference the RCT flyer for the current available package offerings. Please note that there are two options for delivery. If you would like the computer to be delivered directly to your home, there is a \$40 charge for laptops and a \$50 charge for desktops. Families who choose this delivery option will have their order shipped when it is ready. If you would like the device shipped to your child's school there is a \$20 delivery charge and you will need to wait to receive your computer until after the application period closes and it will be delivered to your child's school.

Parents and legal guardians may apply for one computer per student, with a limit of two per household. Please see below for a full list of device specifications.

If you are interested in applying, please complete an online application at https://form.jotform.com/210054491659255 using the group code on the attached program flyer. The application period is from February 8 - March 4, 2022 with delivery to schools taking place prior to the end of the school year.

Please note - There are sections in the RCT Online Application that are no longer applicable:

- · Requirement of Proof or Documentation of Income
- · Requirement to participate in training prior to receiving your computer/laptop

The Section on Course of Study can pertain to elementary or secondary. If you do not have access to a computer or the Internet, please contact the administration team at your school for assistance.
