School Model Confirmation for Semester Two

Earlier this week, you received confirmation of your semester two placement request.

Students who are moving to a new school model can expect to start in the new model along with all students at the beginning of Semester 2 on February 2, 2021. Schools will complete student timetabling in January. As a result of program changes to support these school models, not all semester 2 secondary courses or program pathway options may be available in both models or in all schools. The Board will communicate any program and placement decisions as early as possible to support family and school planning. The home school Guidance staff will work with students and families to support timetable changes in both the Face-to-Face and Virtual models if needed.

There will be no further opportunities to consider changes between the secondary school models this school year.

We want to assure you that we continue to prioritize the health, safety and well-being of our students, and look forward to continuing to support their learning.

Transfers

Each year the York Region District School Board staff work collaboratively to balance student enrolment and accommodation needs in an effort to ensure that students living in a school attendance area can attend their local secondary school. Further, those accepted on transfer into courses and/or programs outside their home school attendance area need to be accommodated without displacing or limiting opportunity for students who live locally. This letter is to inform you of secondary schools open and closed to student transfer requests for the 2021-22 school year in order to assist students in the transfer process and their course selection and pathway choices.

A. The following schools will <u>not</u> be accepting new student transfer requests for the 2021-2022 school year:

- **CEC Central:** Aurora High School (except from Highview PS and Regency PS), Bayview Secondary School, Richmond Hill High School
- CEC East: Markville Secondary School, Pierre Elliott Trudeau High School
- **CEC North:** Newmarket High School
- **CEC West:** Vaughan Secondary School (for French Immersion)

B. The following schools will be open to new student transfer requests for the 2021-2022 school year:

CEC Central: Alexander Mackenzie High School, Aurora High School (only from Regency Acres PS and Highview PS), Dr. G. W. Williams Secondary School, King City Secondary School, Langstaff Secondary School, Richmond Green Secondary School

CEC East: Bill Hogarth Secondary School, Bur Oak Secondary School, Markham District High School, Middlefield Collegiate Institute, Milliken Mills High School, Unionville High School **CEC North:** Dr. John M. Denison Secondary School, Huron Heights Secondary School, Keswick High School, Sir William Mulock Secondary School, Stouffville District Secondary School, Sutton District High School

CEC West: Emily Carr Secondary School, Maple High School, Stephen Lewis Secondary School, Thornhill Secondary School, Thornlea Secondary School, Tommy Douglas Secondary School, Vaughan Secondary School (only for Regular Track), Westmount Collegiate Institute, Woodbridge College

Transfer Process Dates:

• "Home school" refers to the YRDSB face-to-face school you are either attending or would have attended this year.

• Where your signature is required, either an electronic signature or full name entered in the signature field will be accepted as a signature.

By Feb. 5, 2021, Electronic Transfer Request forms must be requested from and are due to the home schools as indicated below:

- **current YRDSB Grade 8 students** request from and submit to your elementary home school
- current secondary school YRDSB students request from and submit to your secondary home school

• Secondary students new to YRDSB for the 2021-22 school year request from, and submit to their YRDSB secondary home school (as indicated in <u>school locator</u>) along with a <u>registration form</u>.

By Feb. 11, 2021, students will be notified of the decision of their transfer request.

By Feb. 24, 2021 course selections are due as indicated below:

• **current Grade 8 YRDSB students** will complete course selection in *My Pathway Planner*

• current secondary school YRDSB students and secondary school students new to YRDSB will complete course selection as indicated by the secondary school

For more information on attendance areas and student transfers, families are encouraged to review the process outlined in <u>Board Policy #108 Student Accommodation – Attendance Areas and Student Transfers</u>. If you have questions about the Transfer process please contact your home school.


