#### Wednesday, November 3: Take Our Kids to Work Day for Grade 9 Students

"Take Our Kids to Work" (TOKW) is a national initiative that provides grade 9 students with the opportunity to observe a work environment or engage in pathway planning for one day. As suggested by the Premier's Highly Skilled Workforce Expert Panel Report, the Take our Kids to Work program will support students to begin planning their future career path by helping them better understand the world of work.

On Wednesday, November 3, 2021, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., grade 9 students will take part in activities that will support them with their pathway planning. Grade 9 students, with the support of their parent/guardians, will have the opportunity to participate in one of the following TOKW opportunities:

- For students who wish to arrange for a virtual/in-person job shadow placement, we ask that parents/guardians review this <u>Family Guide</u> with their child. We also ask that the student provide their selected work location with the <u>Workplace Guide</u>; or
- Students, who would like to participate from their home in a series of dynamic and engaging "Live Stream" webinars on a variety of Career pathways, will be invited to join the Learning Partnership and the Pathways Team, Curriculum and Instructional Services, for a live streamed session. Students will also engage in reflection activities and learn how to use the Pathways Planner and their IPP. #### Spirit Day: Wear Purple on Thursday, October 21, 2021

October 21 is **Spirit Day**, a day started in 2010 by Brittany McMillan, a Canadian teenager. Brittany created the event after learning about youth who lost their lives to suicide after experiencing bullying related to actual or perceived sexual orientation, gender identity and expression identities. It has become an annual event in October when millions of North Americans wear purple to show their support for 2SLGBTQ+ youth and to take a stand against bullying. Students, schools, organizations, corporations, media professionals, celebrities and parents will wear purple on October 21 to send a message that 2SLGBTQ+ youth are to be celebrated and respected for who they are. The purple stripe on the pride flag represents spirit, giving this day its name.

#### **Holocaust Education Week**

The week of November 1st to 7th marks annual Holocaust Education Week (HEW). This year's theme is Holocaust Distortion, Myths and Misinformation: Dispel the myths and misinformation that fuel antisemitism and hatred. The Holocaust was the systemic, state-sponsored persecution and murder of six million Jewish people by the Nazi regime and its allies, and it is critical that we not allow this cruel chapter of modern history to fade from memory. During this week we also want to acknowledge that people of colour, the Romas, people with physical disabilities, and those who identify as LGBTQ+, among others, were targeted and murdered by the Nazis. As one means of working toward a world free of intolerance, racism and hatred, educators will be discussing the Holocaust, as well as the many people who risked, sacrificed, or lost their lives as a result of antisemitism and other forms of hate.

#### **Breakfast Program**

Students will be expected to consume these items while seated in the cafeteria according to all health and safety protocols. These food items may not be eaten in class. #### **Reporting and Full Disclosure**

Dear Parents/Guardians and Grade 12/potential graduating students:

We hope this correspondence finds you and your family well. The purpose of this email is to share:

- 1. Semester 1 Midterm reporting dates for all students
- 2. Full disclosure dates for all students in Grade 11 and/or Grade 12 courses
- 3. Key dates and information for potential graduates applying to Ontario Colleges and/or Universities

#### Semester 1 Midterm Reporting - All students

York Region District School Board will be issuing electronic copies of the Semester 1 midterm report cards between November 25-30. The electronic copy will be sent to the student's GAPPS email and instructions on how to access the report will be emailed to all families prior to their release.

#### Full Disclosure for Grade 11 and Grade 12 Courses

For 2021/2022, the course withdrawal date (Full Disclosure) will be 5 instructional days after the mid-semester report is issued. The Full Disclosure date for Grade 11 and Grade 12 courses is December 6, 2021. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course prior to December 6, 2021, then the course will not be recorded on the Ontario Student transcript. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course after the Full Disclosure date, a withdrawal (W) is entered in the credit column, and the student's mark at the time of withdrawal will be recorded as a percentage in the achievement column of the transcript.

#### **OUAC and OCAS Upload for Potential Graduates**

Identifying information will be shared through a secure transmission to the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) and the Ontario College Application Service (OCAS) to support students with their application to post-secondary institutions. Potential graduates who are not planning to apply to an Ontario college or university this school year, and who do not wish to have their data shared must notify their guidance counsellor by Thursday, October 7, 2021.

Semester 1 midterm marks will be shared with OCAS and OUAC on November 19, 2021. Students in Grade 11 and 12 courses will be notified of their report card mark by their classroom teacher by November 15, 2021. Potential graduates who are applying to an Ontario College and/or University who are planning to drop a course are encouraged to connect with their guidance counsellor in advance of these dates. Guidance appointments can be booked through Teachassist.

#### Please review the timelines below:

November 15	Teachers will share mid semester mark updates with students in Grade 11 and 12 courses.
November 11 - 18	Potential graduates applying to an Ontario College or University that are planning to drop a course, and do not wish to have the course mark shared with OUAC/OCAS are advised to connect with their Guidance Counsellor.
November 19	School to submit Semester 1 midterm and/or final marks (for quadmester courses) to OUAC and OCAS.
December 6	This is the full disclosure date which is the final day that a student, in a grade 11 or 12 course, may drop a course in order that it not be recorded on the Ontario Student Transcript.

We recognize that you and your child may have questions regarding this information. If it is helpful for you to connect with a staff member from the school, please contact a teacher, guidance counsellor or administrator to discuss your questions.

#### City of Markham Ticketing

Please be aware that the school driveways and parking areas are very busy at Town Centre Blvd and Warden in the morning (8:00-8:30 am) and in the afternoon (2:00-2:35 pm). In the morning, please do not park in staff spaces at the Warden entrance. At Town Centre Blvd, you are advised not to park for an extended period in the "No Idle Cars" zone. This is also a Fire Route. This zone is intended only for "quick pick-up or drop-off." Cars that are parked or left idling in this zone can be ticketed by the City of Markham. As well, parking passes are required for all cars in our school lots. Cars without parking passes in our school lots will be ticketed by the City of Markham. Please click here for more information.

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION: YORK REGION SCREENING AND TESTING UPDATES

Friday October 15, 2021

With the support of the COVID 19 vaccine and other public health measures, everyone has been working together to help keep our schools and child-cares safe and we are greatly appreciative of your collective efforts.

It remains critically important to continue to screen your children for symptoms each day to avoid bringing COVID-19 into the schools and child cares and to test them when required. Screening and testing help control the spread of COVID-19. Even if you or your child is fully vaccinated, you must continue with daily screening and testing if you or your child have one or more COVID-19 symptoms.

#### **Screening update**

To provide parents and guardians with more options to screen, including the ability to share results electronically and complete screening in multiple languages, effective Monday, October 18, 2021 York Region Public Health will require students, parents and guardians to use the provincial COVID-19 school and child care screening tool.

The provincial screening tool was updated on Friday October 1, 2021 to **reiterate the need to stay home if you are sick with any COVID-19 symptoms**. This information was previously missing, suggesting children with mild symptoms like runny noses and sore throats were permitted to attend school. This change brings the provincial <a href="COVID-19 school and child care screening tool">COVID-19 school and child care screening tool</a> in line with the York Region school and child care screening requirements.

Students, parents and guardians will still be able to access the <u>link to the tool</u> through the York Region <u>Staying Safe at School</u> webpage. All staff and students must self-screen for signs and symptoms of COVID-19 **every day** before attending school or child care. Even if you or your child is fully vaccinated, you must continue with daily screening and testing if you or your child have one or more COVID-19 symptoms.

#### **MILD SYMPTOMS**

As a reminder, anyone experiencing symptoms, including mild symptoms not included on the provincial screening tool (e.g., runny nose, sore throat, etc.) should **NOT** attend school or child care. If your child has mild symptoms not listed in the screening tool, they can return to school or child care once their symptoms have improved for 24 hours. If your child does have symptoms listed on the screening tool, or their symptoms get worse, they are required to have a PCR COVID-19 test or stay home for 10 days.

#### SIBLINGS AND OTHER CHILDREN LIVING IN THE SAME HOUSEHOLD

York Region Public Health has specific instructions for children living in the same household to further reduce the chance of transmission within schools and child care centres. This means:

If your unvaccinated child is identified as a close contact and is required to isolate (e.g.

exposure in a classroom cohort), unvaccinated children living in the same household must NOT attend school or child care for the duration of the contact's isolation period. Fully vaccinated children living in the same household can continue to attend school as long as they do not have symptoms listed on the screening tool.

• If your fully vaccinated child is identified as a close contact (e.g. exposure in a classroom cohort), they are not required to isolate and can return to school as long as they do not have any symptoms of COVID-19. All children living in the same household can continue attending school or child care as long as they do not have symptoms listed on the screening tool.

Keeping COVID-19 transmission low in the community is important to help prevent the introduction of the virus into schools and child care centres. We continue to encourage everyone who is eligible to get <u>fully vaccinated</u> with two doses of the COVID-19 vaccine as soon as you are eligible. Vaccines are safe, effective and the best way to protect you and those around you from serious illnesses.

#### **Testing update**

To increase access to testing for students, children, school/child care staff, essential visitors and their families, York Region Public Health is partnering with Ontario Health (Central), York Region District School Board (YRDSB) and York Catholic District School Board (YCDSB) to offer **drop-in community based COVID-19** testing at two sites in York Region, in addition to the <u>COVID-19 Assessment Centre</u>.

Drop-in testing will be available for students/children, school/child care staff, essential visitors and their families, ages two years and older, who are symptomatic or who have been identified as a close contact (e.g., are part of a dismissed cohort) or for those with no known exposure or symptoms can receive a COVID-19 test.

Testing will be offered on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays in October and November. Testing options will include PCR saliva and nasal swabs, which will be used at the discretion of the clinician performing the test. Testing is voluntary and consent will be required from parents or guardians for students under 18 years of age. These sites are walk-in and do not require booking an appointment in advance.

Please note, rapid antigen testing will not be available at these testing sites. Rapid antigen testing **should not be used** when an individual is symptomatic or has been identified as a close contact of a case.

What to bring with you: Individuals/families are strongly encouraged to bring their valid Ontario Health (OHIP) card(s) to increase easy accessing of results (you can still get tested if you do not have one) and a face mask or covering, to be worn at all times.

**For saliva testing:** Participants should be well hydrated by drinking a **cup of water 60 minutes before** giving a sample. Participants can **NOT** eat, drink, smoke, vape or chew gum **30 minutes prior** to giving a sample.

You will be able to access your COVID-19 test result online at <a href="mailto:covid-19.ontario.ca">covid-19.ontario.ca</a>, but please keep in mind it may take several days for your results to be processed.

Keeping COVID-19 transmission low in the community is important to help prevent the introduction of the virus into schools and child care centres. We continue to encourage everyone who is eligible to get <u>fully vaccinated</u> with two doses of the COVID-19 vaccine as soon as you are eligible. Vaccines are safe, effective and the best way to protect you and those around you from serious illnesses.

We all have a role to play to keep York Region schools and child cares as safe as possible.


