#### **OSSLT Fall Administration: Thursday, November 18**

This year, there will be two administrations of the OSSLT (Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test).

- The first administration is scheduled to take place on Thursday, November 18. This fall administration is reserved for grade 11 students and for any non-graduating grade 12 students.
- (The second administration will take place in the spring and be reserved for grade 10 students.)
- Only students writing the test will attend school on this day.
- Students not writing the test (grade 9, 10, and 12 classes) will be working from home. Teachers will provide students with asynchronous work.
- Special Education Community Classes will follow their regular schedule.
- School bus and taxi service will run according to their regular schedules.
- Students who plan to graduate next year will be expected to have earned the literacy requirement as per the Ministry of Education.
- The test will be completed using a digital format with technology supplied by the Board.
- Remote students must write at school. Plans are being made to ensure that all health and safety measures are followed.
- In order to prepare for the test, our Literacy Teacher, Mr. Rafik, will be visiting classes and conferencing with individual students.

#### Holocaust Education Week: November 1 - 7

The week of November 1st to 7th marks annual Holocaust Education Week (HEW). This year's theme is <u>Holocaust Distortion, Myths and Misinformation: Dispel the myths and misinformation that fuel antisemitism and hatred</u>. The Holocaust was the systemic, state-sponsored persecution and murder of six million Jewish people by the Nazi regime and its allies, and it is critical that we not allow this cruel chapter of modern history to fade from memory. During this week we also want to acknowledge that people of colour, the Romas, people with physical disabilities, and those who identify as LGBTQ+, among others, were targeted and murdered by the Nazis. As one means of working toward a world free of intolerance, racism and hatred, educators will be discussing the Holocaust, as well as the many people who risked, sacrificed, or lost their lives as a result of antisemitism and other forms of hate.

#### Treaties Recognition Week: November 1-7

Did you know that the first week of November is officially Ontario's Treaties Recognition Week? During the week of November 1-7, 2021, we recognize the importance of treaties and bring awareness to the treaty relationships between Indigenous and non-Indigenous people in the province. There are 46 treaties in Ontario and we all have a responsibility to honour the treaties.

"Today, some Canadians see treaties as artifacts of another era in their history, with no current relevance. First Nations people view treaties as "living" agreements that respect their status as nations, as recognized in the Royal Proclamation of 1763. They see this as their "inherent right" referred to in Section 35 of the Canadian Constitution."

#### Semester 1 Midterm Reporting - All students

York Region District School Board will be issuing electronic copies of the Semester 1 midterm report cards between November 25-30. The electronic copy will be sent to the student's GAPPS email and instructions on how to access the report will be emailed to all families prior to their release.

#### Full Disclosure for Grade 11 and Grade 12 Courses

For 2021/2022, the course withdrawal date (Full Disclosure) will be 5 instructional days after the mid-semester report is issued. The Full Disclosure date for Grade 11 and Grade 12 courses is December 6, 2021. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course prior to December 6, 2021, then the course will not be recorded on the Ontario Student transcript. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course date, a withdrawal (W) is entered in the credit column, and the student's mark at the time of withdrawal will be recorded as a percentage in the achievement column of the transcript.

#### **OUAC and OCAS Upload for Potential Graduates**

Identifying information will be shared through a secure transmission to the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) and the Ontario College Application Service (OCAS) to support students with their application to post-secondary institutions. Potential graduates who are not planning to apply to an Ontario college or university this school year, and who do not wish to have their data shared must notify their guidance counsellor by Thursday, October 7, 2021.

Semester 1 midterm marks will be shared with OCAS and OUAC on November 19, 2021. Students in Grade 11 and 12 courses will be notified of their report card mark by their classroom teacher by November 15, 2021. Potential graduates who are applying to an Ontario College and/or University who are planning to drop a course are encouraged to connect with their guidance counsellor in advance of these dates. Guidance appointments can be booked through Teachassist.

November 15	Teachers will share mid semester mark updates with students in Grade 11 and 12 courses.
November 11 - 18	Potential graduates applying to an Ontario College or University that are planning to drop a course, and do not wish to have the course mark shared with OUAC/OCAS are advised to connect with their Guidance Counsellor.
November 19	School to submit Semester 1 midterm and/or final marks (for quadmester courses) to OUAC and OCAS.
December 6	This is the full disclosure date which is the final day that a student, in a grade 11 or 12 course, may drop a course in order that it not be recorded on the Ontario Student Transcript.

#### **City of Markham Ticketing**

Please be aware that the school driveways and parking areas are very busy at Town Centre Blvd and Warden in the morning (8:00-8:30 am) and in the afternoon (2:00-2:35 pm). In the morning, please do not park in staff spaces at the Warden entrance. At Town Centre Blvd, you are advised not to park for an extended period in the "No Idle Cars" zone.
