We want to acknowledge the professionalism and dedication of our educators as they implement this new model, which enables students to remain connected with staff and peers in their home school, and allows for greater flexibility between remote and in-person learning options, and maintaining the continuity of learning.

We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause for families and thank you for your patience and support.

#### **Reporting and Full Disclosure**

Dear Parents/Guardians and Grade 12/potential graduating students:

We hope this correspondence finds you and your family well. The purpose of this email is to share:

- 1. Semester 1 Midterm reporting dates for all students
- 2. Full disclosure dates for all students in Grade 11 and/or Grade 12 courses

3. Key dates and information for potential graduates applying to Ontario Colleges and/or Universities

#### Semester 1 Midterm Reporting - All students

York Region District School Board will be issuing electronic copies of the Semester 1 midterm report cards between November 25-30. The electronic copy will be sent to the student's GAPPS email and instructions on how to access the report will be emailed to all families prior to their release.

#### Full Disclosure for Grade 11 and Grade 12 Courses

For 2021/2022, the course withdrawal date (Full Disclosure) will be 5 instructional days after the mid-semester report is issued. The Full Disclosure date for Grade 11 and Grade 12 courses is December 6, 2021. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course prior to December 6, 2021, then the course will not be recorded on the Ontario Student transcript. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course date, a withdrawal (W) is entered in the credit column, and the student's mark at the time of withdrawal will be recorded as a percentage in the achievement column of the transcript.

#### **OUAC and OCAS Upload for Potential Graduates**

Identifying information will be shared through a secure transmission to the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) and the Ontario College Application Service (OCAS) to support students with their application to post-secondary institutions. Potential graduates who are not planning to apply to an Ontario college or university this school year, and who do not wish to have their data shared must notify their guidance counsellor by Thursday, October 7, 2021.

Semester 1 midterm marks will be shared with OCAS and OUAC on November 19, 2021. Students in Grade 11 and 12 courses will be notified of their report card mark by their classroom teacher by November 15, 2021. Potential graduates who are applying to an Ontario College and/or University who are planning to drop a course are encouraged to connect with their guidance counsellor in advance of these dates. Guidance appointments can be booked through Teachassist.

#### Please review the timelines below:

November 11 - 18	Potential graduates applying to an Ontario College or University that are planning to drop a course, and do not wish to have the course mark shared with OUAC/OCAS are advised to connect with their Guidance Counsellor.
November 15	Teachers will share mid semester mark updates with students in Grade 11 and 12 courses.
October 22	Students will receive a secure communication in their GAPPS email which provides their OEN, school MIDENT# (BSID), and OUAC PIN (if applicable). This information is needed to apply to college and university through OCAS and OUAC.
October 7	Deadline for potential graduates who are not planning on applying to an Ontario college or University to notify their Guidance Counsellor if they do not want data shared with OCAS/OUAC this school year.

November 19	School to submit Semester 1 midterm and/or final marks (for quadmester courses) to OUAC and OCAS.			
December 6	This is the full disclosure date which is the final day that a student, in a grade 11 or 12 course, may drop a course in order that it not be recorded on the Ontario Student Transcript.

# Community-BASED TESTING for Schools and child Care centres AVAilable Starting October 12, 2021

#### Friday October 8, 2021

To increase access to testing for students, children, school/child care staff, essential visitors and their families, York Region Public Health is partnering with Ontario Health (Central), York Region District School Board (YRDSB) and York Catholic District School Board (YCDSB) to offer **drop-in community-based COVID-19** testing at two sites in York Region, in addition to the <u>COVID-19</u> Assessment Centre.

Drop-in testing will be available for students/children, school/child care staff, essential visitors and their families, ages two years and older, who are symptomatic or who have been identified as a close contact (e.g., are part of a dismissed cohort) or for those with no known exposure or symptoms can receive a COVID-19 test.

Testing will be offered on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays in October and November with the first site starting **Wednesday, October 13, 2021**. Based on the needs in the school and child care community, testing sites may remain open beyond November. Additional testing dates will be shared in future communications should this be extended.

Testing options include PCR saliva and nasal swabs. One determining factor for a child's ability to complete a PCR saliva test is their ability to produce a sufficient amount of saliva. The clinician will advise on the appropriate test option. Families interested in potentially completing a saliva test should be prepared by drinking a **cup of water 60 minutes before** giving a sample. Participants can **NOT** eat, drink, smoke, vape or chew gum **30 minutes prior** to giving a sample

Testing options include PCR saliva and nasal swabs, which will be offered at the discretion of the clinician performing the test. Testing is voluntary and consent will be required from parents or guardians for students *under 18 years of age*.

Rapid antigen testing will not be available at these testing sites. Rapid antigen testing **should not be used** when an individual is symptomatic or has been identified as a close contact of a case.

The sites are **walk-in** and do not require booking an appointment in advance.

**Who is eligible:** Students/children, school/child care staff, essential visitors and their families age two years and older who are symptomatic or who have been identified as a close contact (e.g. are part of a dismissed cohort) can receive a COVID-19 test.

What to bring with you: Individuals/families are strongly encouraged to bring their valid Ontario Health (OHIP) card(s) to increase easy accessing of results (you can still get tested if you do not have one) and a face mask or covering, to be worn at all times.

**For saliva testing:** Participants should be well hydrated by drinking a **cup of water 60 minutes before** giving a sample. Participants can **NOT** eat, drink, smoke, vape or chew gum **30 minutes prior** to giving a sample.

**How to access your results:** You are able to access your COVID-19 test result online at <u>covid-19.ontario.ca</u>; Note: It may take several days for your results to be processed.

## Why is this testing being offered?

Additional testing is being provided to support schools and child care centres with access to testing in addition to opportunities at COVID-19 Assessment Centres. This testing will:

- Support timely access to testing where students/children or staff are symptomatic and screen out of school or child care
- Support case finding in schools/child care centres where transmission may be occurring or has occurred in the setting to better isolate and control risk
- Provide more convenient access to testing for individuals who are part of dismissed cohorts
- Increase access to testing for students, children and staff who are not symptomatic but are part of a school with dismissed cohorts or an increase of cases within the school setting
- Support families to be tested at the same time



#### Biography:

Nate Leipciger was born in Chorzow, Poland, in 1928. He immigrated to Toronto in 1948, where he eventually obtained a university degree in engineering. Nate was a member of the International Council of the Auschwitz-Birkenau Museum for fifteen years and has been an educator on the March of the Living for nineteen years. Nate lives in Toronto with his wife Bernice, their children, many grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. Nate is the author of the memoir, *The Weight of Freedom*.



#### Book Synopsis:

Nate Leipciger, a thoughtful, shy eleven-year-old boy, is plunged into an incomprehensible web of ghettos, concentration and death camps during the German occupation of Poland. Demonstrating incredible strength of character as he struggles to survive, he forges a new, unbreakable bond with his father and yearns for a free future. With memories that remain etched in tragedy and pain even as he looks optimistically to the future, Nate builds a new life in Canada. Introspective and raw, yet ever hopeful, *The Weight of Freedom* is Nate's vivid journey through a past that can never be left behind.

## Update on community vaccination clinics for students eligible for Hepatitis B, Human Papillomavirus (HPV) and Meningococcal vaccination

October 4, 2021

Due to York Region Public Health's continued COVID-19 response, non-essential Public Health service such as school-based vaccination clinics for students continue to be on hold until further notice.

Starting in November, York Region Public Health will be providing community vaccination clinics for all eligible Grade 7 students who will miss their doses of vaccines usually offered in their school. In addition, all eligible grade 8 and 9 students who missed any doses of these vaccines due to school closures and the pandemic response will also be able to attend a community vaccination clinic to receive their Hepatitis B, Human Papillomavirus (HPV) and Meningococcal vaccines.
