Schools Reopening January 17 to In-Person Learning

As we prepare for schools to reopen for in-person learning, there are a few important updates we want to share with you.

Potential class and school closures

As staff members and students are <u>required to self-isolate</u> with increased cases of COVID-19, schools may encounter operational challenges. Please be aware that there may be occasions when classrooms or schools are required to close to in-person learning and move to virtual learning for a period of time. Schools will notify families as soon as possible when this is the case. Families are asked to develop a routine of checking email regularly at the start and end of every day for important communication from the school and Board given our circumstances.

Information from York Region Public Health

Please read this update from York Region Public Health that includes important information about:

- COVID-19 screening
- What to do if your child develops symptoms and/or tests positive for COVID-19
- Vaccines
- Public health measures

Daily Screening

The Ministry has directed school boards to implement the **daily-on-site confirmation** of self-screening for all secondary students commencing January 17, 2022.

Process:

Step 1: Secondary students must self-asses by using the <u>COVID-19 School and Child-Care Screening Tool</u> prior to entering the school on a daily basis.

Step 2: After they finish the self-assessment, they respond to the question, "Have you completed the self-screening test?" in the Confirmation <u>Form</u>.

• The student receives an email when they respond "Yes". The email will include a colour code specific to the day of the week:

MONDAY, TUESDAY, WEDNESDAY, THURSDAY, FRIDAY

- In the Period 1 classroom, students are to provide confirmation of self-screening using one of the following:
- a) Smartphone email (or a picture of the email from their computer)
- b) Hard copy of the email
- c) If neither of the above options is available, they can provide a verbal response confirming completion.

Masks

Masks must be worn by all students. Three-layer masks are recommended. For those students who don't have at least a three-ply cloth mask, the school can provide one to the family. Three-ply cloth masks will be distributed to students next week at school. Families should continue to ensure their child is wearing an appropriate mask.

Reporting of Cases

We know families have many questions about the public reporting of school cases, following the Government of Ontario's announcement that <u>school cases will no longer be reported</u>. In place of reporting COVID-19 cases, the Ministry of Education is requiring schools to monitor and report on the number of student and staff absences (personal information will not be shared). The Ministry will be sharing these numbers publicly beginning the week of January 24. We remain committed to being transparent with our families and will ensure this information is accessible on the <u>COVID-19 reporting page on our Board website</u>.

In addition, as noted above, there may be occasions when classrooms or schools are required to close to in-person learning as a result of isolation requirements. We will also share data on classroom and school closures on the <u>COVID-19 reporting page on our Board website</u>.

Transportation

Transportation schedules for students will be the same as the schedules followed September to December (before the school closures). Students who were attending school and transported during the closure period will revert to their schedule prior to school closure. As bus drivers are also<u>required to isolate</u> with increased cases of COVID-19, bus routes may encounter challenges obtaining replacement driver coverage. Please be aware that there may be **occasions when bus routes may be canceled and families will need to make alternate transportation arrangements or shift to virtual learning for a period of time**. Schools will notify families as soon as possible when this is the case. Families of bused students are asked to check <u>net.schoolbuscity.com</u> every morning to verify bus runs and cancellations.

Learning Model Change Requests

Due to the ever changing conditions of the pandemic and the individual circumstances affecting families, we recognize that you may want to switch the learning model of your child at this time. If you wish to make a model change **for the duration of semester one** (up to and including Friday, February 4, 2022), <u>please complete and submit this form</u>.

Please do NOT submit this form if you have already contacted the main office or a vice principal to request a change. Families who have already requested a change should have received an email confirmation.

All model change requests at this time will apply only for the duration of semester one (up to Friday, February 4, 2022).

Please note: <u>This Google Form</u> must be completed by a parent/guardian or adult student (18+). Your email will be recorded when you submit. Your request will be approved, and you will receive a copy of your response form as a receipt.

By the first week of February, we will be in contact with all families again asking them about a model change for semester two, which commences on Monday, February 7, 2022.



Canada Recovery Caregiving Benefit Extended

The CRCB is extending until **May 7, 2022**. The maximum number of weeks you can apply for also increases to **44 weeks**. You can apply retroactively until February 16, 2022 if you are eligible.

The Canada Recovery Caregiving Benefit (CRCB) gives income support to employed and self-employed individuals who are unable to work because they must care for their child under 12 years old or a family member who needs supervised care. This applies if their school, regular program or facility is closed or unavailable to them due to COVID-19, or because they are sick, self-isolating, or at risk of serious health complications due to COVID-19. The CRCB is administered by the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA).

If you are eligible for the CRCB, your household can receive \$500 (\$450 after taxes withheld) for each 1-week period.

If your situation continues, you will need to apply again. Each household may apply for up to a total of 44 weeks between September 27, 2020 and May 7, 2022.

Cap and Gown Orders for Graduates

If you would like to book a graduation photo session in April (currently scheduled for April 19-29), please pay the graduation fee on School Cash Online **by February 17, 2022**. This is to allow for delivery and distribution of the graduation cap and gown by the Grad Photo Day date. The graduation fee is required for students participating in the graduation ceremony being held on June 27, 2022, at the Hilton Markham (8500 Warden Ave.). The cost includes the souvenir cap & gown, venue rental, refreshments and two guest tickets to the ceremony. **Please be aware that the in-person graduation ceremony may only take place if permitted by York Region Public Health. The souvenir cap and gown portion of the graduation fee is not refundable.**

<u>Click here to pay the graduation fee</u> so that your cap and gown order is placed by February 17, 2022. Meeting this deadline is required to ensure your cap and gown arrive prior to graduation photo days. **You will be expected to wear a cap and gown for your school graduation photo session.**

Dr. Brenda Wastasecoot, Assistant Professor of Indigenous Studies, Arts & Science Faculty at University of Toronto. Brenda is Ininu (Cree) and a member of the York Factory First Nation. She was raised in Churchill, Manitoba, in a little village known as The Flats. After studying and teaching at Brandon University in Brandon, Manitoba, she came to Toronto to do her PhD at OISE - Ontario Institute for Studies in Education. Her thesis dissertation tells the story of her family and the impacts of Indian Residential schools. "Showing and Telling the Story of Nikis; Arts Based, Auto-Ethnographic Journeying of a Cree Adult Educator."

Monday, February 28, 2022 @ 7:15 to 8:00 PM – Ms. Gen-Ling Chang

Gen-Ling Chang is the deputy executive director with ALPHA Education committed to social justice, humanity and global peace; after she retired as associate director, Toronto District School Board. She also serves as chair of school and community relations with the Asian Canadian Educators Network. With years of experience on addressing the impact of systemic racism in policy and practice on individuals and communities, Gen-Ling continues to work with youth, educators, leaders, and communities on authentic inclusive participation, representation, and diversity.

Dr. Ann E. Lopez, is a professor of educational leadership and policy in the Department of Leadership, Higher and Adult Education, Ontario Institute for Studies in Education, University of Toronto. She is the Director of the Center for Leadership and Diversity and Provostial Advisor, Access Programs. Dr. Lopez is the immediate past president of the National Association for Multicultural Education (NAME). Her research and teaching focuses on antiracist education, school leadership across contexts, decolonizing and socially just leadership, issues of equity in education and schooling, and most recently developing concepts of what she describes as *"ProLovePedagogy"*. Dr. Lopez has published several articles and written 5 books including her most recent book entitled *Decolonizing Educational Leadership: Alternative Approach to Leading Schools*. Dr. Lopez is co-Editor-In-Chief of the Journal of School Leadership, Co-Series Editor, Studies in Educational Administration, and the recipient of the 2020 Award for Distinguished Contributions to Teaching at the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education.
