#### **Report Cards**

Our reports provide you information about your child's achievement throughout the second semester. Of note is that this reporting period reflects learning that has occurred in a modified learning environment as required by the provincial public health guidelines. As a result, the rate of progress described in this report may differ from previous years due to the ongoing impact of COVID-19 on student learning. We hope that this report will provide valuable feedback for your child while supporting conversations about learning at home.

Report cards are part of the ongoing communication from our school to support student achievement

and well-being. Distribution of your child's final report card for the second semester will begin on July 8,

2021. These reports will be distributed using the same process used for Midterm and Interim Reports via student GAPPS accounts.

#### End of Semester Plans & Selection of Learning Model

As the 2020-2021 school year draws to a close, we would like to take this opportunity to provide you with an update on end of year activities and some information regarding the 2021-2022 school year.

We know that students and staff members have worked extremely hard over the past school year and have continuously adjusted to the changing requirements presented by the COVID-19 global pandemic. On behalf of everyone at the York Region District School Board, we thank you for your ongoing support and efforts to mitigate and reduce the transmission of COVID-19 in our schools and communities.

Due to your efforts and an accelerated vaccination program, we remain cautiously optimistic to return to more in-person learning and experiences that enrich the educational journey of children and youth. York Region Public Health (YRPH) have issued a <u>letter to families</u> that outlines rationale for this optimism, and we're grateful to them for their ongoing partnership.

#### 2021-2022 Caring and Learning Plan - Selection of Learning Models

As previously announced, families will have the option to select in-person or virtual learning. To ensure families are making this decision with as much up-to-date information as possible, we anticipate that this process will take place July 28 - August 16. More information will be released at that time about how to make this selection.

The Caring and Learning Plan will focus on ensuring that the Board meets all protocols from public health authorities and focuses support on students' well-being, including mental health. We know children and families have faced many challenges throughout the pandemic and we'll work to provide as much care and education support as possible. As always, if you have any concerns for your child's well-being, please speak to the school directly.

#### June 22 - School Preparation Day Elementary & Secondary

On June 22, all elementary and secondary students, including Community Class students who are currently attending in person, will be provided with asynchronous learning activities so that staff may prepare for the transition to in-person learning in September 2021. Students in community classes who are currently attending face-to-face will need to make alternate arrangements as schools will be closed to students and transportation will be cancelled. As mentioned previously, there is reason for optimism for returning to in-person learning in September and educators and school staff will be busy preparing classrooms and schools.

#### June 28 - Last Day of school for Secondary Students

For secondary students June 28 is dedicated to credit conferencing and recovery, and lessons will not be delivered on this day (this is in addition to June 18, which is also a credit recovery day). Class attendance will not be taken.

#### June 25, 28 - Student Materials Retrieval and Return Days

On these dates, schools will plan to have students return to the school to retrieve any personal belongings that may have been left behind before the closure of schools in April. At this time, students will also return school materials/technology that they may have borrowed.

#### 2021-2022 Secondary Model

Secondary schools are continuing to timetable for the 2021-2022 school year, keeping in mind requirements from the Ministry of Education and public health protocols. Beginning in September, pending confirmation from the Ministry of Education, we anticipate all secondary students to be attending school daily for the full school day. Our Board will continue to use the modified four course semester model (i.e. a rotation of two courses per day on a weekly basis). You will receive more information with schedules as timetables are finalized.

#### **Re: Student Material Retrieval and Return Process**

On **Friday June 25** and **Monday June 28**, students and families can safely return items that belong to UHS (e.g. textbooks, library books, musical instruments, sheet music, technology, parking passes) and pick up any items left at school/assigned to them. This process is by appointment only (8:30 am - 3:30 pm) using the Google Form below:

#### Appointment Bookings for Materials Drop-Off/Pick-Up June 2021

If you are currently using a board-issued laptop or chrome-book and you <u>are returning</u> to a YRDSB school in the fall, please keep your device for use over the summer. If you <u>are not returning</u> to a YRDSB school in September, you must return all YRDSB technology. Students are expected to return all school items and anything else that is property of the YRDSB.

#### Guidelines for Visit:

- Visits to the school must be conducted within the Public Health Guidelines. A mask must be worn and a two-meter distance must be maintained at all times while on school property.
- Entry will be at Town Centre Blvd. only and exit will be at Warden (or stairwell #3 to return to Town Centre parking). Please arrive on time.
- Please sanitize your hands upon entering and exiting the building. Do not wear gloves.
- A <u>Covid-19 School and Child Care Screening</u> must be conducted prior to arrival. Please do not come to the school if you are experiencing symptoms.

- Students must drop-off and retrieve items individually. No additional family members will be allowed to enter the building.
- There will be no access to classrooms, washrooms or drinking fountains.
- If your child has medication at school, please call us in advance if you'd like it to be available for pick-up.

#### Attention Graduates: Download Your Work on YRDSB Google Drive

This is a message for all Graduates and any student leaving YRDSB at the end of June. Students who wish to keep work that has been saved on the YRDSB Google Drive (GAPPS account) will need to download it as soon as possible - no later than the end of June. They will not have access to this account after this time.

Instructions on how to Download your Google Data

1. Select the Google Apps and Services you want to export your data and documents from, and select the option to receive the file as a download via email (depending on the size of your Google account, this could take several hours). Use the .zip file option.

2. Once the Google Takeout email arrives, use the links to download your archived data and documents to the personal computer, USB/external drive and/or the personal Google Drive that you wish.

3. You can "unzip" the archives and then upload the data and documents to a new personal Google Account or use the files and documents in Microsoft Office or other applications.
