November is Hindu Heritage Month

On December 8, 2016, the province of Ontario designated November as Hindu Heritage Month as outlined in [the Hindu Heritage Month Act](#). Hindus first arrived in Canada at the beginning of the 20th century. During various waves of immigration, Hindus from all parts of the world continued to make Canada their home from the 1960s to present day. There are many Hindus who have settled in the Greater Toronto Area, including York Region. "By proclaiming the month of November as Hindu Heritage Month, the Province of Ontario recognizes the important contributions that Hindu Canadians have made to Ontario's social, economic, political and cultural fabric. Hindu Heritage Month is an opportunity to remember, celebrate and educate future generations about Hindu Canadians and the important role that they have played and continue to play in communities across Ontario."

Hinduism is considered by some as one of the world's oldest religions, dating back over 10,000 years. With over 900 million followers worldwide, Hinduism is the third-largest religion. Hinduism is a henotheistic religion that worships one God without denying the existence of other gods. Some of these deities include Brahma, Shiva, Paarvathi, Lakshmi, Ganesha, Muruga, Kaali, and Vishnu, along with others. Hinduism consists of many traditions and festivities that are celebrated throughout the year. Diwali, Navaratri, and Ganesh Chaturthi are some main ones in which Hindus participate in Ontario, Canada, and around the world.

OSSLT Fall Administration: Thursday, November 18

This year, there will be two administrations of the OSSLT (Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test).

- **The first administration is scheduled to take place on Thursday, November 18. This fall administration is reserved for grade 11 students and for any non-graduating grade 12 students.**
- (The second administration will take place in the spring and be reserved for grade 10 students.)
- Only students writing the test will attend school on this day.
- Students not writing the test (grade 9, 10, and 12 classes) will be working from home. Teachers will provide students with asynchronous work.
- Special Education Community Classes will follow their regular schedule.
- School bus and taxi service will run according to their regular schedules.
- Students who plan to graduate next year will be expected to have earned the literacy requirement as per the Ministry of Education.
- The test will be completed using a digital format with technology supplied by the Board.
- Remote students must write at school. Plans are being made to ensure that all health and safety measures are followed.
- In order to prepare for the test, our Literacy Teacher, Mr. Rafik, will be visiting classes and conferencing with individual students.

Reporting and Full Disclosure: See Updates Below

Semester 1 Midterm Reporting - All students

York Region District School Board will be issuing electronic copies of the Semester 1 midterm report cards between November 25-30. The electronic copy will be sent to the student's GAPPS email and instructions on how to access the report will be emailed to all families prior to their release.

Full Disclosure for Grade 11 and Grade 12 Courses

The Full Disclosure date for Grade 11 and Grade 12 courses is December 10, 2021. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course prior to December 10, 2021, then the course will not be recorded on the Ontario Student transcript. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course after the Full Disclosure date, a withdrawal (W) is entered in the credit column, and the student's mark at the time of withdrawal will be recorded as a percentage in the achievement column of the transcript.

OUAC and OCAS Upload for Potential Graduates

Semester 1 midterm marks will be shared with OCAS and OUAC on November 19, 2021. **Students in Grade 11 and 12 courses will be notified of their report card mark by their classroom teacher by November 16, 2021.**

Potential graduates who are applying to an Ontario College and/or University who are planning to drop a course are encouraged to connect with their guidance counsellor in advance of these dates. Guidance appointments can be booked through Teachassist.

Please review the timelines below:

November 16	Teachers will share mid semester mark updates with students in Grade 11 and 12 courses.
November 11 - 18	Potential graduates applying to an Ontario College or University that are planning to drop a course, and do not wish to have the course mark shared with OUAC/OCAS are advised to connect with their Guidance Counsellor.
November 19	School to submit Semester 1 midterm and/or final marks (for quadmester courses) to OUAC and OCAS.
December 10	This is the full disclosure date which is the final day that a student, in a grade 11 or 12 course, may drop a course in order that it not be recorded on the Ontario Student Transcript.

We recognize that you and your child may have questions regarding this information. If it is helpful for you to connect with a staff member from the school, please contact a teacher, guidance counsellor or administrator to discuss your questions.

Parking at UHS & City of Markham Ticketing

Please be aware that we are setting out pylons at the front of the school to allow school vehicles to safely pick up and drop off our students. When the pylons are out, please keep this area clear for school authorized vehicles. We thank you for driving safely and respecting staff who facilitate these Board transportation services.

Please be aware that the school driveways and parking areas are very busy at Town Centre Blvd and Warden in the morning (8:00-8:30 am) and in the afternoon (2:00-2:35 pm). In the morning, please do not park in staff spaces at the Warden entrance. At Town Centre Blvd, you are advised not to park for an extended period in the "No Idle Cars" zone. This is also a Fire Route. This zone is intended only for "quick pick-up or drop-off." Cars that are parked or left idling in this zone can be ticketed by the City of Markham.

Alternatively, in order to reduce congestion, you may consider dropping off and picking up your child further away from the school.

As well, parking passes are required for all cars in our school lots. Cars without parking passes in our school lots will be ticketed by the City of Markham.




As such, students were invited to share their personal narratives and artwork related to their mental health, studies, personal development, school spirit and any other topics that aligned with our topic, a snapshot in time.
