Secondary PA Day Changing from November 19 to November 15, 2021

The Secondary School Professional Activity (PA) Day originally scheduled for November 19, 2021 is changing and will now occur on **November 15, 2021**. Secondary schools will be closed to students on November 15, 2021 and reopen on November 16, 2021. A regular school day is scheduled for November 19, 2021, and students are expected to attend.

The adjustment of the date is in response to challenges associated with the pandemic and the modified semester secondary school model required by the Ministry of Education. The timing of this change comes as a result of a recent agreement between the Board and the local Ontario Secondary School Teachers' Federation District 16, which will allow for a change to the current timetable model which will more effectively support our students along with better supporting our teachers, in our secondary schools. This change will also enable teachers to ensure that marks are entered into TeachAssist to ensure students are provided with advance notice of marks that will be uploaded to the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) and the Ontario College Application Centre (OCAS).

We appreciate this may be an inconvenience for some and appreciate your cooperation to better meet the needs of students. If you have any questions about your child's progress, please contact their teacher.

Learning Model Changes

In September, we shared that we would provide families further information to support switching between in-person and remote learning models prior to mid-semester.

Students learning remotely may request to return to face-to-face learning by contacting the school. Changes will be facilitated within 1-2 days.

Requests may also be made to move from in-person learning to remote learning. Please contact the school to request a switch to remote learning. Staff from the school will make arrangements to contact you to review the request and share information about the hybrid learning model.

- Learning model changes for students affected by COVID-19 will be facilitated within 2-3 school days.
- Model change requests will be facilitated as soon as possible and prior to mid-semester reporting.

After mid-semester reporting, students and families may request a short-term COVID-19 related model change or a long-term model change for other circumstances by contacting the school.

Lunch Protocols

We are continuing to follow all YRPH safety protocols during lunch. These include the following:

- Staggered dismissal to reduce crowding
- Separating grade cohorts by floor
- Remaining seated while unmasked; practicing proper donning and doffing of masks
- Limited capacity in designated lunchrooms (sign-in required), hallways, the library (sign-in required) and at lunch tables in the foyer and cafeteria
- Disinfection of designated lunchrooms and the library prior to the afternoon block
- Providing distance between tables in the cafeteria by extending them into the atrium
- Asking students to use the washrooms that have been assigned to their classes for the week
- No access to the servery, vending machines and no food deliveries allowed
- Use of fill stations only as opposed to drinking fountains

We recognize that there have been requests for microwaves. Because microwaves can potentially be used by hundreds of students, we are currently consulting to devise a plan for safe use of microwaves, including frequent sanitizing. As students are now eating on separate floors, we also need to consider the placement of microwaves in the school, in order to avoid crowding and ensure safety protocols can be followed at all times.

Extra-Curriculars: Clubs & Sports

We currently have 24 clubs running, not including our Student Council (USAC). Each club or council has a staff advisor who submitted an application that was approved by the administration. Students who wish to create a club must first find a staff member who is willing to supervise. The staff advisor submits the application. All club/council meetings must be supervised by a staff member. Since clubs/councils run after school and consist of mixed cohort groups, most of them are running virtually on a designated day of the week (or bi-weekly) and at a designated time (i.e. usually starting at 3:30 once students have had time to return home). The option of meeting in person requires that we follow the direction of YRDSB and YRPH:

“As multi-cohorts may be mixed, a two-meter distance must be maintained at all times between participants.”

This prevents clubs of more than 15 students from convening in a regular classroom. Our larger spaces, such as the atrium and cafeteria are being used by Music repertoire for part of the week. The library is being used for After-School Literacy classes, Student Council meetings, and Wellness Council Meetings.

With regard to sports, up to this time, only outdoor sports have been permitted. At UHS, we have provided opportunities for students to participate in cross-country, tennis and soccer. As of today, after extensive consultation with York Region Public Health, YRDSB has announced that indoor high contact sports will also be permitted. However, YRDSB is currently working to implement a centralized process by which participating students will be able to attest that they have been fully vaccinated. For any indoor high-contact sport that a school offers outside of instructional time, all participating students must provide proof of being fully vaccinated. High contact indoor sports will remain on pause at UHS until an attestation process is finalized and potential coaches have had enough time to review protocols and consider their commitments.

No specific extra-curricular activities are guaranteed, as teacher supervision and coaching are provided on a voluntary basis.

When clubs and sports are being run voluntarily by school staff, announcements are made on our PA system. These announcements are also posted on our Student Life Website. Some clubs advertise using posters in the school. All clubs create a Google Classroom and invite students to access the join code. Our Student Council is planning to host a Virtual Clubs Fair soon that will provide all students with information about our current clubs.

OSSLT Fall Administration: Thursday, November 18

This year, there will be two administrations of the OSSLT (Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test).

- **The first administration is scheduled to take place on Thursday, November 18. This fall administration is reserved for grade 11 students and for any non-graduating grade 12 students.**
- (The second administration will take place in the spring and be reserved for grade 10 students.)
- Only students writing the test will attend school on this day.
- Students not writing the test (grade 9, 10, and 12 classes) will be working from home. Teachers will provide students with asynchronous work.
- Special Education Community Classes will follow their regular schedule.
- School bus and taxi service will run according to their regular schedules.
- Students who plan to graduate next year will be expected to have earned the literacy requirement as per the Ministry of Education.
- The test will be completed using a digital format with technology supplied by the Board.
- Remote students must write at school. Plans are being made to ensure that all health and safety measures are followed.
- In order to prepare for the test, our Literacy Teacher, Mr. Rafik, will be visiting classes and conferencing with individual students.

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Reporting and Full Disclosure

Semester 1 Midterm Reporting - All students

York Region District School Board will be issuing electronic copies of the Semester 1 midterm report cards between November 25-30. The electronic copy will be sent to the student's GAPPS email and instructions on how to access the report will be emailed to all families prior to their release.

Full Disclosure for Grade 11 and Grade 12 Courses

For 2021/2022, the course withdrawal date (Full Disclosure) will be 5 instructional days after the mid-semester report is issued. The Full Disclosure date for Grade 11 and Grade 12 courses is December 6, 2021. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course prior to December 6, 2021, then the course will not be recorded on the Ontario Student transcript. If a student withdraws from a Grade 11 or 12 course after the Full Disclosure date, a withdrawal (W) is entered in the credit column, and the student's mark at the time of withdrawal will be recorded as a percentage in the achievement column of the transcript.

OUAC and OCAS Upload for Potential Graduates

Identifying information will be shared through a secure transmission to the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) and the Ontario College Application Service (OCAS) to support students with their application to post-secondary institutions. Potential graduates who are not planning to apply to an Ontario college or university this school year, and who do not wish to have their data shared must notify their guidance counsellor by Thursday, October 7, 2021.

Semester 1 midterm marks will be shared with OCAS and OUAC on November 19, 2021. Students in Grade 11 and 12 courses will be notified of their report card mark by their classroom teacher by November 15, 2021. Potential graduates who are applying to an Ontario College and/or University who are planning to drop a course are encouraged to connect with their guidance counsellor in advance of these dates. Guidance appointments can be booked through Teachassist.

Please review the timelines below:

November 15	Teachers will share mid semester mark updates with students in Grade 11 and 12 courses.
November 11 - 18	Potential graduates applying to an Ontario College or University that are planning to drop a course, and do not wish to have the course mark shared with OUAC/OCAS are advised to connect with their Guidance Counsellor.
November 19	School to submit Semester 1 midterm and/or final marks (for quadmester courses) to OUAC and OCAS.

December 6

This is the full disclosure date which is the final day that a student, in a grade 11 or 12 course, may drop a course in order that it not be recorded on the Ontario Student Transcript.

We recognize that you and your child may have questions regarding this information. If it is helpful for you to connect with a staff member from the school, please contact a teacher, guidance counsellor or administrator to discuss your questions.

City of Markham Ticketing

Please be aware that the school driveways and parking areas are very busy at Town Centre Blvd and Warden in the morning (8:00-8:30 am) and in the afternoon (2:00-2:35 pm). In the morning, please do not park in staff spaces at the Warden entrance. At Town Centre Blvd, you are advised not to park for an extended period in the "No Idle Cars" zone. This is also a Fire Route. This zone is intended only for "quick pick-up or drop-off." Cars that are parked or left idling in this zone can be ticketed by the City of Markham. 


As such, students were invited to share their personal narratives and artwork related to their mental health, studies, personal development, school spirit and any other topics that aligned with our topic, a snapshot in time.
