News from the Special Education Department

On behalf of Unionville High School, we would like to welcome you to the 2019-2020 school year! Some of you will be familiar with the services and supports provided by the Special Education department for your child, while for others, this is something completely new! You may find more information on the board website at www.yrdsb.ca; click the Programs and Services tab, then select Special Education.

The following are common terms that we use in the Special Education Department.

IPRC - Identification, Placement and Review Committee – A committee made up of school and Board personnel that makes decisions about the identification of your child (i.e. Learning Disability, Gifted, etc.) and the program placement (i.e. Withdrawal Assistance, Indirect Service, etc.) The IPRC meeting for students new to YRDSB or for students who are changing their program placement will happen by early October, 2016. Parents/guardians may attend, but attendance is not mandatory.

IEP- Individualized Education Plan – A plan or program developed to ensure that a student who has a disability identified under the law receives specialized instruction and related services and accommodations.

SERT- Special Education Resource Teacher – A teacher who is qualified to teach Special Education and is responsible for producing your child's IEP. The SERT communicates with the student, teacher, and parents/guardians to ensure that the student is successful in his or her courses.

If you feel that there is a classroom issue to be addressed, please contact the subject teacher, as they provide the program for all students in the class. If this does not address the issue, you should then contact the SERT. Our expectation is that by the time the student is in grade 12, he/she can self-advocate with the classroom teacher, without intervention from the parents/guardians or SERT.

We look forward to working with you and your child to ensure a successful school year. Please feel free to contact us if you have any questions, comments, or concerns.

IEP's will be completed by October 15, 2019.

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
