
Founded in 1986 as the Arts York program, UHS has been a leader in the delivery of arts education across the region and beyond.





To ensure equity all visual arts students were provided an art kit to create remotely. Images of the completed student art work would be uploaded to Google Classroom and evaluated / assessed.





Ms. Gardham's Grade 10 AU class undertook watercolor commission projects for staff members to raise funds for Markham Stouffville Hospital.





















Community Projects: Unionville BIA – Instagramable Murals

Grade 12 AU class created Instagramable mini murals in collaboration with BIA to help drive foot traffic back to local business along Main Street Unionville.








WARDEN WALL MURAL DESIGN


My identity as an artist is very detailoriented and sticks to a "more is more"

Continue to Develop Anti-Black & Anti-Oppressive Framework


- Continue to partner with Indigenous Artists, Elders and Knowledge Keepers and members for various communities. Continue to build these relationships











