

## **Purpose of School Council**



## School Council 2019-2020 Responsibilities Highlights

- Principals are responsible for:
  - be a member of the school council;
  - attend all school council meetings (vice-principal may be designates);
  - ensuring that a school council is established that represents the school community;
  - communicating and collaborating with school councils;
  - actively seeking representation;
  - make known the names of members of the school council
  - forwarding information on community resources to school councils;
  - provide written notice of the dates, times and locations of the meetings;

# Principals are Responsible for:

- Principals are responsible for:
  - solicit the views of the school council;
  - ensure that any fundraising carried out by the school council aligns with the school improvement plan;
  - ensure that the financial records are maintained at the school;

# School Council Code of Ethics

- consider the best interests of all students;
- be guided by the school and the Board's mission statements;
- become familiar with the school's policies and operating practices;
- follow the Board's Equity and Inclusive Education policy;
- treat all other members with respect;
- not disclose confidential information;
- use established communication channels;
- declare any conflict of interest;
- not accept any payment or benefit financially through school council involvement.

### **Elections**

- first 30 calendar days school year;
- responsibilities
  - hold office from date elected or appointed;
  - be able to be re-elected or re-appointed;
  - one vote, when a consensus cannot be reached and voting is necessary;
  - one vote, in votes taken by a committee of the school council on which the member sits;

#### Elections

- The number of parents should be defined in your constitution, otherwise it will be six.
- A parent member cannot be employed at the school
- If a parent works for the Board but not at your school, they can be a parent member if they inform the school community prior to the election.

One Student Representative (optional at Elementary Level)

- Appointed by the student council.
- In elementary schools, may be appointed by Principal after consulting with school council.

### **Elections**

#### Community Representative

- At least one but may appoint up to four, if you make such a bylaw in your constitution.
- If a person works for the Board but not at your school, they can be a community member they inform the school community prior to the election.

The School Principal

• If he or she is unable to attend a meeting, he/she may send the Vice-Principal.

One Teaching Staff Representative

• Elected by the teachers of the school.

One Support Staff Representative

#### School Council 2019-2020 Responsibilities Highlights

- School councils are responsible for:
  - supporting and promoting parent, family and community engagement in support of student learning;
  - participating in the development and implementation of the school improvement plan;
  - communicating with, and providing ongoing advice to, the principal matters pertaining to the school;
  - collaborating;
  - election procedures and the filling of vacancies between elections;
  - hold elections for members of school councils during the first 30 calendar days of each school year;
  - ensure that a parent qualifies;
  - meet at least four times during the school year;
  - record and maintain minutes of all meetings;
