

<sup>\*\*</sup> In groups 1, 2 and 3, a maximum of 2 credits in French as a second language can count as compulsory credits, one from group 1 and one from either group 2 or group 3.

<sup>\*\*\*</sup> A maximum of 2 credits in cooperative education can count as compulsory credits.

<sup>†</sup> The 12 optional credits may include up to 4 credits earned through approved dual credit courses.

# **The Grade 10 Literacy Test**



- A Diploma requirement. Administered in March of the grade 10 year
- A test based on language and communication (reading and writing) expectations of curricula up to and including grade 9
- Accommodations, deferrals and exemptions may be appropriate for some students
- If standard not met in first attempt, schools will provide support; test is re-administered until student successfully completes the test or the Grade 12 Literacy Course

## 34 Credit Threshold

- Most students will complete 30 credits within four years.
   If needed, students may earn up to 34 credits within five years.
- While enrolled in their first four consecutive years of secondary school, students may go beyond 34 credits (e.g., music repetoire, summer school, night school, elearning)
- After secondary school, going beyond the 34 credit threshold is possible with:
  - E-learning
  - Night School
  - Summer School
  - Independent Learning Centre
  - Adult Day School







Grade 12 students returning for <u>one</u> semester only can select **one spare** 




- •If you want to add a ninth course, you must select it <u>first</u> in order to open up another elective.


