Safe, Caring and Supportive Schools Policy

- *It is the policy of the YRDSB to promote caring and safe school and work environments in order to optimize student learning.*
- *The YRDSB Safe Schools Policy applies to misconduct while a student is engaged in any activity that may have an impact on the school community.*

We work closely with York Regional Police and have officers assigned to our school. You will often see them in the building.

- This policy is included in 'Guide to the 2016-2017 School Year' which was distributed at the beginning of the school year. New students should pick up a copy in the main office.
- Make sure that you are aware of the consequences that apply for inappropriate behaviour.

Safe, Caring and Supportive Schools Policy

*Activities Leading to Possible **Suspension**—Education Act s.306 (1)*

- uttering a threat to inflict serious bodily harm on another person
- possessing alcohol or illegal drugs
- being under the influence of alcohol
- swearing at a teacher or at another person in a position of authority

*Activities Leading to Possible **Suspension** - continued*

- committing an act of vandalism that causes extensive damage to school property at the pupil's school or to property located on the premises of the pupil's school
- bullying/cyber-bullying
 - at school
 - at a school-related activity
 - or where the activity will have a negative impact on the school climate

*Activities Leading to Suspension Pending Possible **Expulsion** –s. 310 (1)*

- possessing a weapon, including possessing a firearm
- using a weapon to cause or to threaten bodily harm to another person
- committing physical assault –causes bodily harm –medical practitioner
- committing sexual assault



*Activities Leading to Suspension Pending Possible **Expulsion** –s. 310 (1)*

- trafficking in weapons or in illegal drugs
- committing robbery
- giving alcohol to a minor
- Board determined activity leading to expulsion at a school-related activity or where the activity will have a negative impact on the school climate

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

18 compulsory credits

Students must earn the following compulsory credits to obtain the Ontario Secondary School Diploma:

4	credits in English (1 credit per grade)*
3	credits in mathematics (1 credit in Grade 11 or 12)
2	credits in science
1	credit in Canadian history
1	credit in Canadian geography
1	credit in the arts
1	credit in health and physical education
1	credit in French as a second language
0.5	credit in career studies
0.5	credit in civics

In addition, students must complete:

✓	12 optional credits†
✓	40 hours of community involvement activities
✓	the provincial literacy requirement

Plus one credit from each of the following groups:


* A maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.

** In groups 1, 2 and 3, a maximum of 2 credits in French as a second language can count as compulsory credits, one from group 1 and one from either group 2 or group 3.

*** A maximum of 2 credits in cooperative education can count as compulsory credits.

† The 12 optional credits may include up to 4 credits earned through approved dual credit courses.

The Grade 10 Literacy Test



- A Diploma requirement. Administered in March of the grade 10 year
- A test based on language and communication (reading and writing) expectations of curricula up to and including grade 9
- Accommodations, deferrals and exemptions may be appropriate for some students
- If standard not met in first attempt, schools will provide support; test is re-administered until student successfully completes the test or the Grade 12 Literacy Course

Liability Insurance

- Return to Guidance and collect your form from the Guidance secretary. **If your activity has been approved then you can complete your volunteer activities.**

- M = Arts Unionville
- L = ESL class
- 8 = Female Gym
- 9 = Male Gym

34 Credit Threshold

- Most students will complete 30 credits within four years. If needed, students **may earn up to 34 credits within five years.**
- While enrolled in their first four consecutive years of secondary school, students may go beyond 34 credits (e.g., music repertoire, summer school, night school, e-learning)
- After secondary school, going beyond the 34 credit threshold is possible with:
 - o E-learning
 - o Night School
 - o Summer School
 - o Independent Learning Centre
 - o Adult Day School



The 34 Credit Threshold does not apply to:

- Students with an IEP
- International (VISA) students
- To English as a Second Language (ESL) core language courses and/or English Literacy Development core language courses



Career Cruising and Secondary Online Course Selection

Career Cruising is an interactive career guidance and pathways planning tool designed for people of all ages. The tool can help students to explore different career options, manage course selections online--and plan various pathways to meet the requirements for their desired path.

Grades 6-12+ students are directed to sign into the site with their district assigned account. The portfolio username for students is york-xxxxxxxxx where xxxxxxxx is the student ID. When logging in for the first time the password will be the student's birth date using the format mmdyyy. The system will prompt the student for a new password after successfully logging in for the first time. All students will start their portfolios from scratch in Career Cruising. Students from Grades 8 through 12+ will perform their course selections through the Course Planner module on the Career Cruising site.
