

<p><b><u>MAP, CHART, TABLE: Note!</u></b></p> <p>A.P.A. requires that information about the map/chart/table should be written <b>below the item in your essay/paper NOT in the References list</b></p>	<p>Prince Edward Island(2010). <i>Atlas of Canada</i>. Reader's Digest.</p>
<p><b><u>CLASS HANDOUT</u></b></p> <p>Dietrich, D. (2014). <i>Laboratory safety overview</i> [Class handout]. Unionville, ON: Unionville HS, SBI3U.  Author's last name, initials. (Date of publication). <i>Title of handout</i> [Class handout]. School location: School name, Course code.</p>	<p>(Dietrich, 2014)</p>

## Tips!

\*Author's last name followed by initials

\*Date comes **after name of author/editor** (in brackets)

\*Title of book in *italics*-capitalize first word and proper nouns only

\*Place of Publication:

City, **Province** (for Canada)

City, **State** (for U.S.)

City, **Country** (elsewhere)

\*\*\* At U.H.S. you must include **page numbers** with in-text citations.
