

## **Advice to Researchers:**

- →The research you are doing here is different than using the internet to find out what movie is playing at the local Cineplex.
- → Academic research takes TIME.
- → Note that not all websites contain reliable information. Make sure you know **who** is responsible for the information.
- →Note that our board has purchased the **Encyclopedia Britannica** -this is a reliable starting point but most assignments require more detailed and sophisticated sources.
- → Remember to keep track of your sources, recording all the information you will need for your **Works Cited**. Forms for tracking your research are available at the circulation desk and on the library website.
