## Vaping Health Risks

Acknowledging the growing issue of vaping in our schools and the health risks associated with ecigarettes and vaping, Caring and Safe Schools has developed the **Substance Misuse Webinar**: **Vaping** in collaboration with York Region Public Health. This 12 minute webinar provides valuable information for staff and families about:

- e-cigarettes, also known as vapes
- e-juice and what it is made of
- the safety concerns associated with vaping
- how to discuss this substance with children.
