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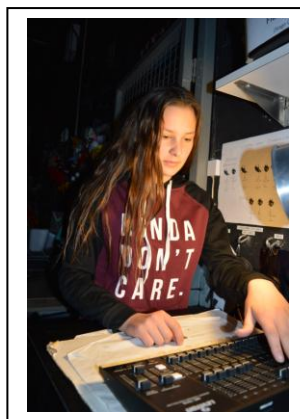
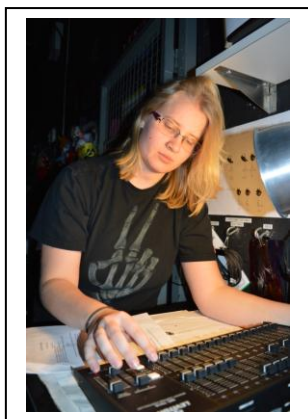

I wanted to share with you that Facebook has today announced the launch of a new Facebook Parents Portal, that features new resources for parents. According to Facebook, the new portal is aimed at assisting conversations between parents and their children about staying safe online. The new Facebook Parents Portal is now live and can be accessed at www.facebook.com/safety/parents.

Psychologists recommend two keys for parents when it comes to using technology:

1. Have tons of conversations with kids about what they're doing online and how to be safe. If this is a normal part of daily discussion, then if something difficult comes up, your child will be more willing to share or ask for help.
2. And have guidelines in place as a family. These can address screen time, online content, and rules about sharing access to all social media accounts.

Literacy

Dear parents and guardians:

On **Thursday, March 30, 2017**, Grade 10 students across the province will write the **Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test (OSSLT)**. It will also be written by students who were previously eligible but have not yet written the test or who were unsuccessful on their first attempt. The OSSLT is administered by the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO), an independent agency of the Government of Ontario, in order to determine whether students have acquired the minimum literacy (reading and writing) skills expected by *The Ontario Curriculum* across all subjects up to the end of Grade 9.

Next week, students who are writing the test in March will receive an 'OSSLT information package' in their homeroom classes; this package will include additional information regarding the test.

In the coming months, students can prepare as they would for any other test. They can also access useful resources and practice materials through the 'Vaughan Literacy Moodle', the EQAO website, 'V.S.S's WSI Literacy activities,' as well as a Google Forms-based practice-version of the OSSLT. To access the following resources, please follow the steps that are outlined below.

The 'Vaughan Literacy Moodle': Check the 'Vaughan Literacy Moodle' for important updates / announcements, as well as very useful resources.

1. Go to: <https://moodle2.yrdsb.ca>
2. Sign-in with 'Username and Password' (*the same username / password that students use to sign-in at school)
3. Scroll to the bottom of the page, to the 'Search courses' box
4. Type 'Vaughan Literacy Moodle' into the search box
5. Click on the 'Vaughan Literacy Moodle' link
6. Click on 'enrol me'

There is no password required to use this Moodle

1. Log-on to a school computer
2. Click on the Windows start button (in the bottom left-hand corner of the desktop screen)
3. Click on 'Computer'
4. Click on 'StudentsResources (X:)'
5. Open the 'OSSLT' folder
