Covid-19 Updates



Isolation Requirements:

- If you have symptoms or have tested positive
- If someone in your household is positive and you are not vaccinated
- 5 days if the symptomatic individual is vaccinated or under 12
- 10 days if the symptomatic individual is not vaccinated



Isolation can end early if symptoms have improved for 24 hours (48 for gastro) AND 2 negative RATS taken 24-48 hours apart



Masks are still STRONGLY RECOMMENDED, but it is MANDATORY in the following scenarios:

- Days 6-10 after a 5 day isolation period if you are positive
- A Vaccinated individual may still attend school, but must wear a mask while any household member is isolating at home
- For 10 days after last day of exposure to a positive individual
- 14 days after international travel

Parent, Family & Community Engagement Advisory Committee

School administrators are asked to share registration information with a delegation of up to 10 school community members who are representative of our diverse parent communities, in particular those who are representative of racialized or marginalized community groups. Invitees may include but should not be limited to, school council members. Recognizing the importance of the partnership between parents, families and the school community, one administrator from each school is asked to attend the Symposium.



MICROAGGRESSIONS HURT

Discrimination, no matter how subtle, has consequences.

How should we respond?

How to Respond to Microaggressions?

Everyday, subtle, intentional - and oftentimes unintentional interactions or behaviours that communicate bias or discrimination against members of marginalized groups such as racial or ethnic minorities.

- 1. Stop, interrupt, and address the behaviour; ensure any bystanders hear
- Name the behaviour
- 3. Report the behaviour
- 4. Support the individual
- 5. Educate
