## Authentic Parent Engagement

$>$ Sarah (VDPS Council Chair) attended a School Council Forum Workshop on Authentic parent engagement
> There are Four equally important key areas in Authentic Parent engagement

1. INFORM- School informs parents/caregivers and families through newsletters, google classroom updates and report cards.
2. CONSULT- School asks for parents/caregivers and families feedback on lunch options for students, grade 8 grad trips, date preference for council meetings
3. COLLABORATE- School works with parents/caregivers and families to co-develop a series of family evenings, co-plan process for students, educators and families to discuss achievement, and co- construct classroom practices.
4. INVOLVE- School involves parents through supervision on excursions, participating in class lesson to do activity i.e. share stories with students and educators, utilize parents/ caregivers transferable skills.
> Spoke with the YRDSB Equity and Inclusion Coordinators Palvi and Oksana. They have offered us a 3 session module to learn more about Authentic parent engagement, the many ways parents can learn to support their children, school and community and how we can apply methods to our school. Ms. Swerling has suggested inviting neighbouring schools to join workshop.

> Movie Night Fundraiser can be run to support cost of End of Year Party as long as parents are informed that this is the purpose of the fundraiser
$>$ Council can charge for food ahead of time

> Try to use activities that are free/donated
> Can charge a wristband/admission fee to raise funds
